COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course examines health issues in the community in terms of organization, resources, programming, and special populations. Field trip experiences designed to connect and integrate theory with specific activities in a “real” environment are required in this course.

PREREQUISITE: None

EXPECTED OUTCOMES:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will:

- Analyze health education communication methods & techniques in a community context
- Describe how a comprehensive school health program is organized and implemented
- Understand leadership roles in community health organizations
- Develop health education resources for dissemination to different audiences
