ESL 102 -English as Second Language II

CREDIT HOURS: 2.00

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course guides students through the four language learning components: Listening, Reading, Speaking, and Writing. Students will learn to recognize and apply aspects of American pronunciation and focus on grammatically contextualized paragraphs. In addition, students will explore American culture.

PREREQUISITE: ESL 101 or by placement

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will:

- Demonstrate a comprehension and understanding of authentic communication activities which integrate speaking, listening, reading and writing skills.
- Understand grammatical constructions to accurately and effectively express ideas in English.
- Build a basic vocabulary
- Demonstrate comprehension and appropriate use of idiomatic expressions and vocabulary in English.
- Demonstrate proficient use of basic phonetics
- Develop comprehension of clear, organized and developed logically written sound sentences.
- Apply comprehension and use of American culture conventions in oral communication
- Use of sound system of American English to understand and accurately express ideas in oral communication.

ASSESSMENT METHODS:

Student performance may be assessed by examination, quizzes, case studies, oral conversation, group discussion, oral presentations. The instructor reserves the option to employ one or more of these assessment methods during the course.
