HLS 202 Homeland Security Emergency Management

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed for emergency response personnel and will survey emergency and disaster management. Topics include: history of domestic and international terrorism, natural and technological hazards and risk assessment; and the emergency management disciplines of mitigation, response, recovery, preparedness and planning.

PREREQUISITES: *HLS 100*

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will:

- Describe the history of emergency management with the United States.
- Describe natural and technological hazards risk assessment.
- List the disciplines of emergency management.
- Explain the mitigation process of emergency management.
- Explain the response process of emergency management.
- Explain the recovery phase of emergency management.
- Explain the preparedness phase of emergency management.
- Explain the communications phase of emergency management.
- Discuss the international efforts in emergency management.
- Describe the new threat of terrorism and how it will affect emergency management.
- Describe how the future in terrorism will effect emergency management.
