COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is a study of global logistics with an emphasis on looking at the whole world as one potential market. Additionally, an analysis of the global supply chain and current issues such as import/export regulations will also be reviewed.

PREREQUISITES:

LOG 101 and LOG 103

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will be familiar with:

1. An understanding of International logistics concepts.
2. To differentiate between import/export controls in international shipping.
3. Understand logistics development in different nations.
4. The importance of international transportation and traffic management.
5. An understanding of movement to and from ports.
6. An understanding of the various documentation and insurance.
7. Hazardous Materials international transportation.
