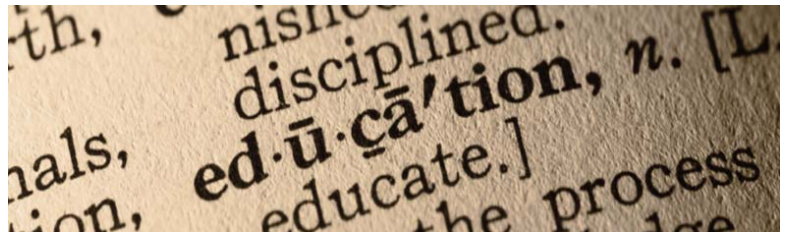

- Pay attention to the URL of a website. Malicious websites may look identical to a legitimate site, but the URL may use a variation in spelling or a different domain (e.g., .com vs. .net).
- Install and maintain anti-virus software, firewalls, and email filters.

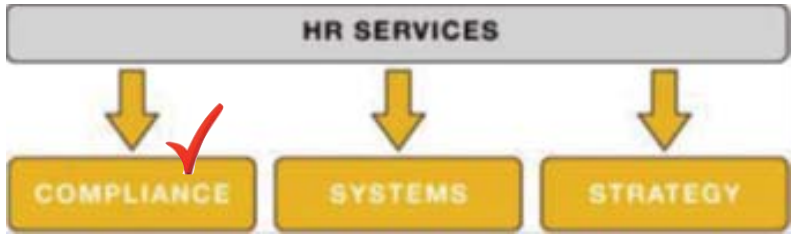
Chancellor's Book Club

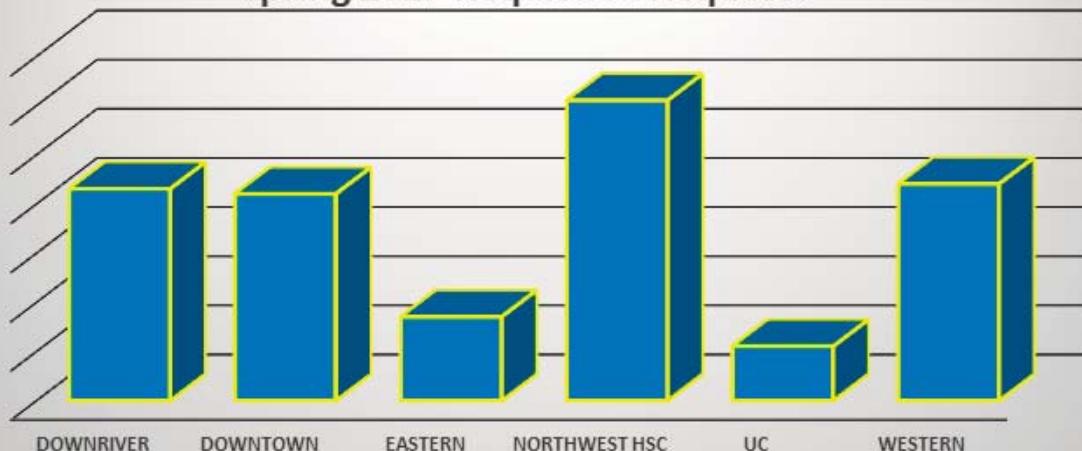

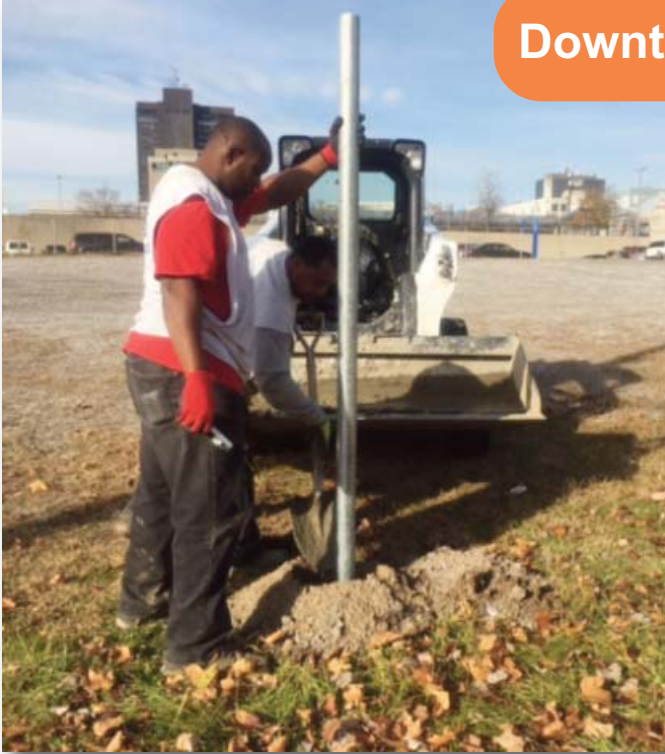
District Office Building

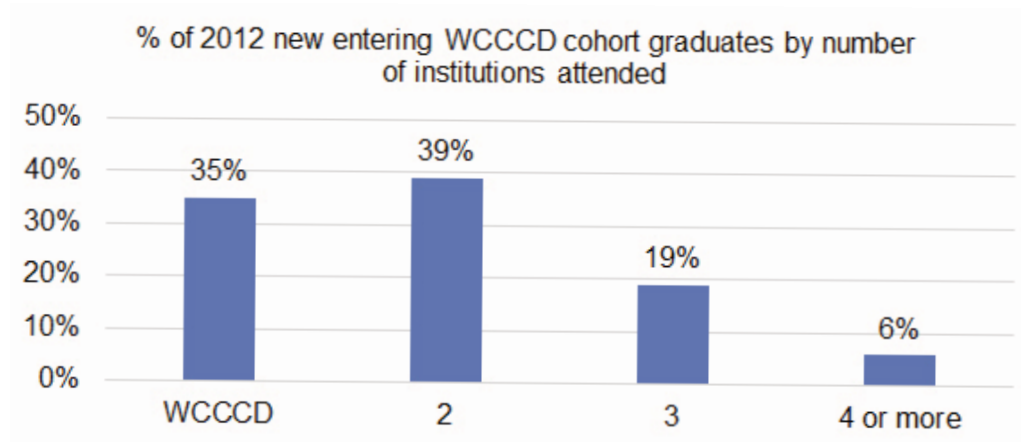

What's Trending in IE: Student Mobility Between Multiple Colleges

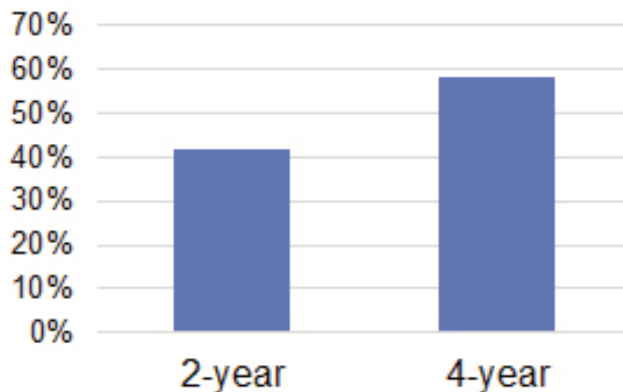
The Division of Institutional Effectiveness reviews national research and trends in community colleges to better understand and provide data to support the district's student success initiatives. According to the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC), more than one in four students attend two or more institutions to complete their associate degree. The longer students take to complete their degree the more they swirl. Of the students who took more than six years to earn an associate degree:

- 9.4% attended only one institution
- 32.0% attended two institutions
- 58.6% attended three institutions

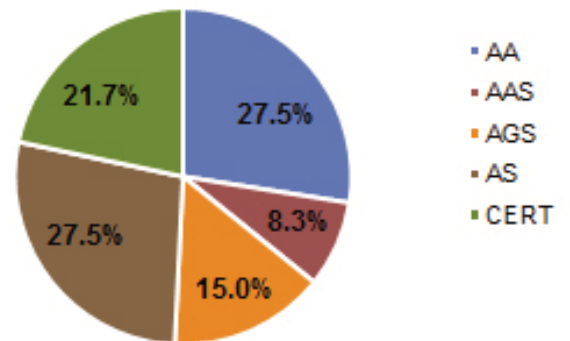

Department of Labor Successful Cyber Program Review!



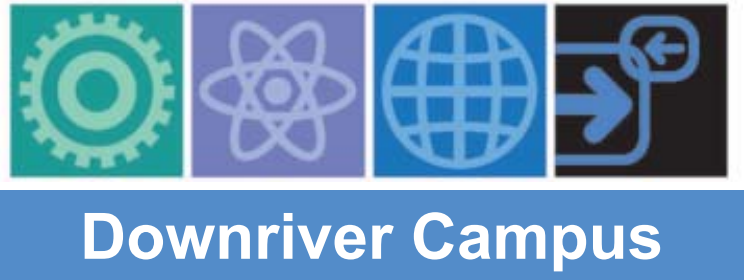

Intercultural Conversations

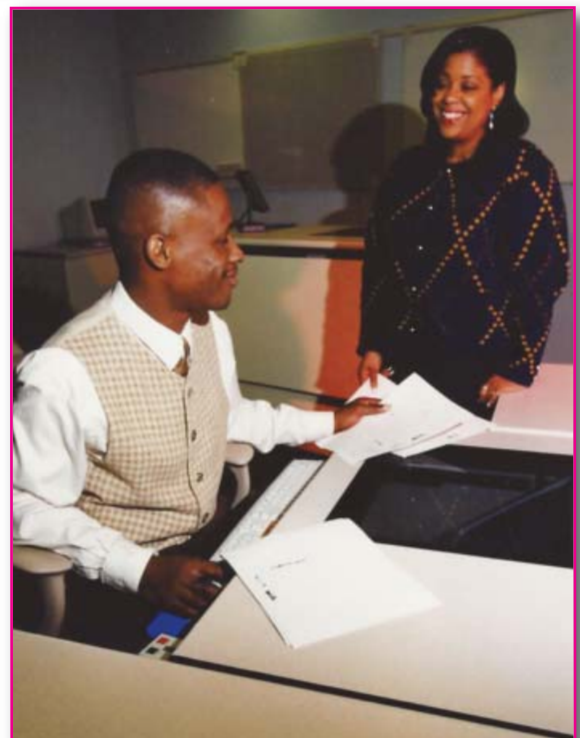

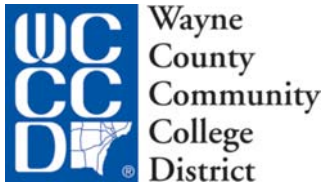
