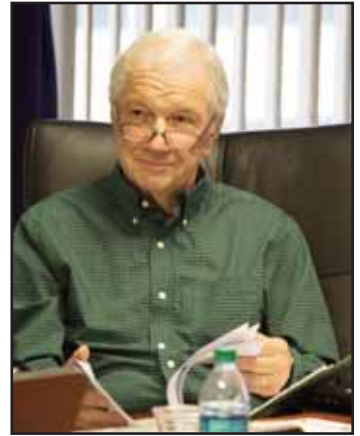

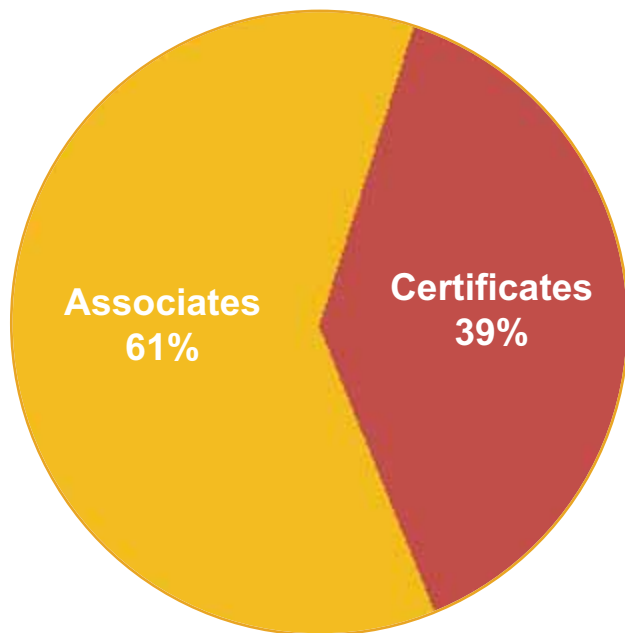
# Division of Institutional Effectiveness

## WCCCD and National Research Trends

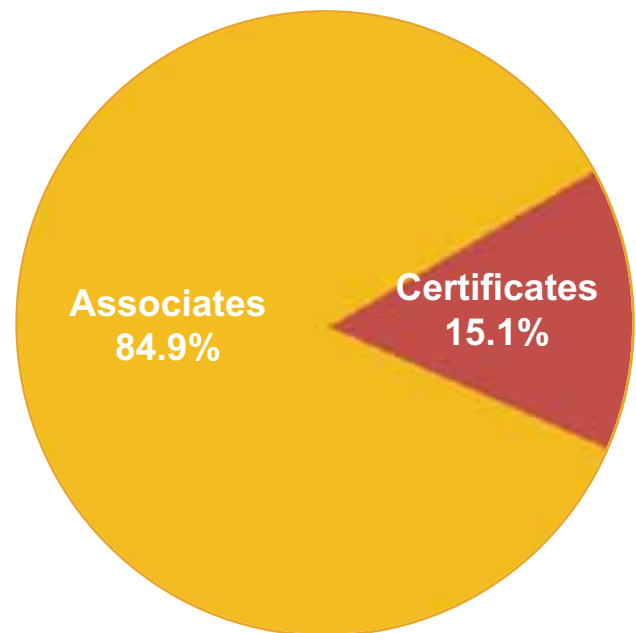

According to the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC), between 2000 and 2014, the number of certificates awarded at community colleges increased by 236 percent.

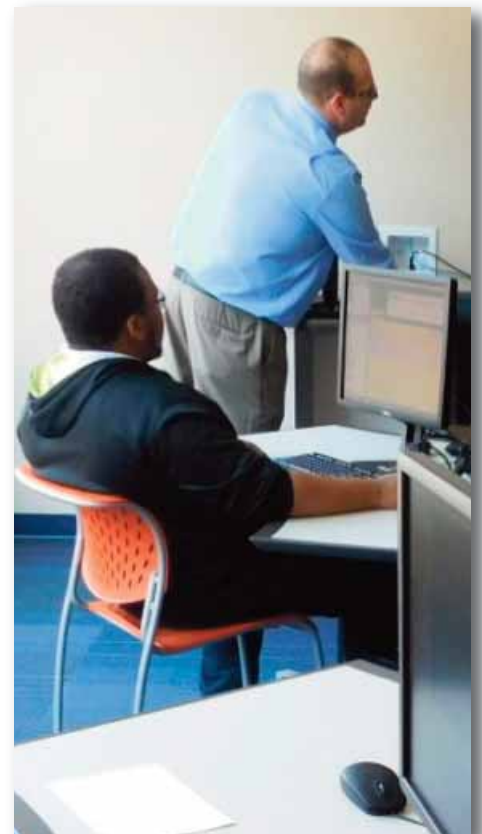

## Michigan Colleges Online and the Americans with Disabilities Act Initiatives



The Michigan Colleges Online (MCO) has been researching various avenues to assist community colleges with online disability services that will align with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Some areas that colleges are looking to address include:

- Comprehension for students, staff, faculty, and visitors with any sort of reading disability.
- Providing an extra “learning modality” for students with various cognitive disabilities.
- Assisting students, staff, faculty, and visitors with mild to moderate vision disabilities.
- Assisting language acquisition for non-native speakers of English.
- Access by all students to review publicly served content or as a general study aid.
- Help build overall awareness of disability access and usability.



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## Competency Based Education

Competency Based Education (CBE) are models of “flexibly paced programs of learning in which progress toward a degree is determined by what students demonstrate they know and are able to do, regardless of time spent in a classroom.”

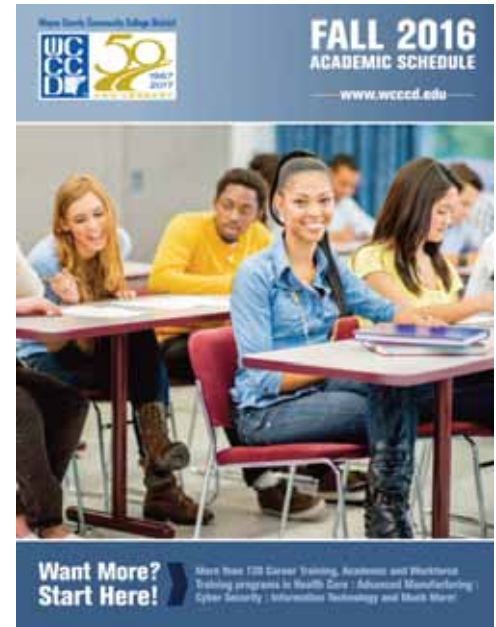

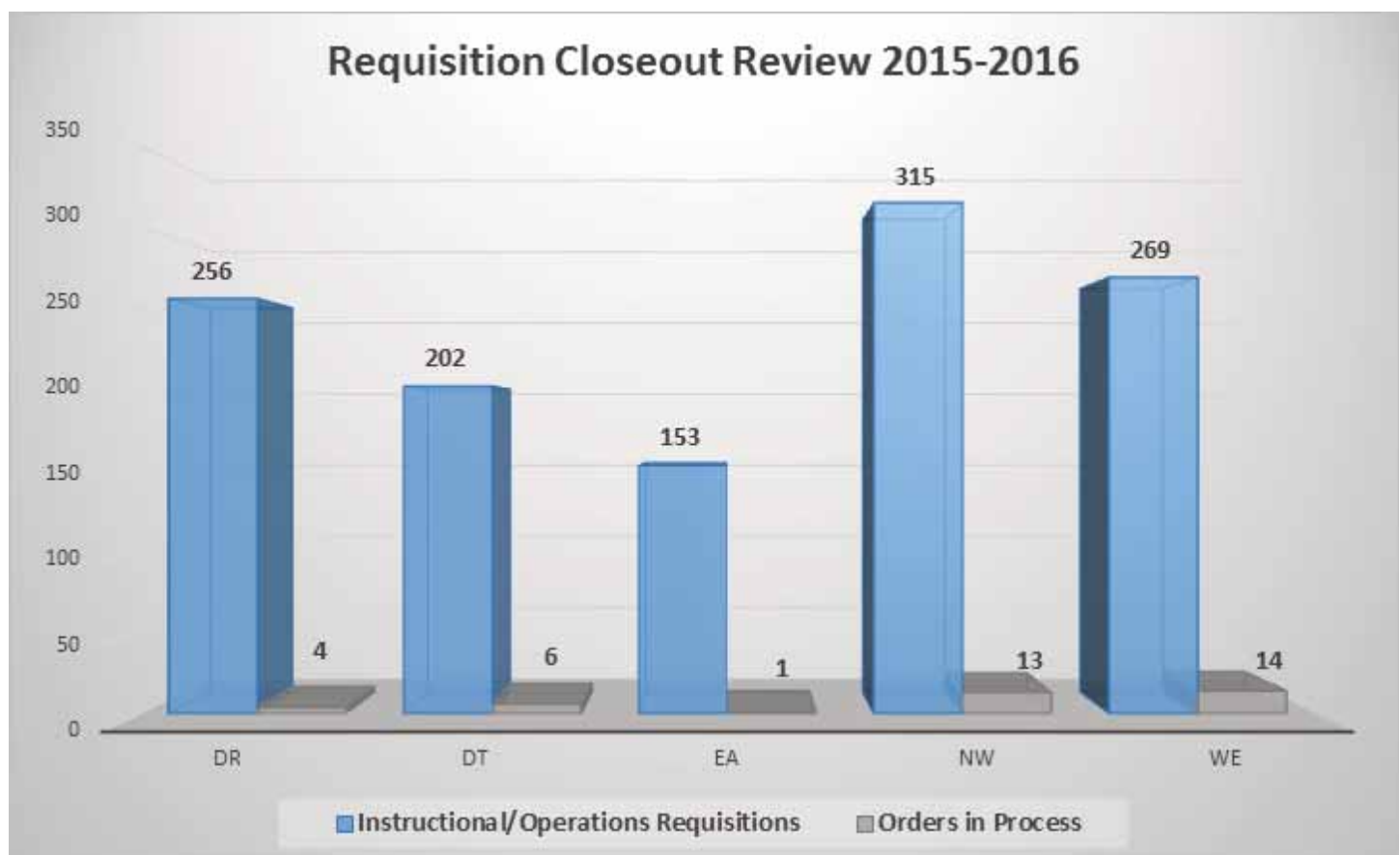
# Office of Accountability and Transparency
