During this period, the HR team visited all campuses in order to assist employees and to give them the opportunity to make any needed changes to their benefits plan as well as re-enroll in any optional benefits such as:

- Enroll in medical, vision and dental plans
- Add or drop dependents
- Choose to participate in Healthy Futures, take your health assessment and record your healthy activities
- Opt out of insurance. Must have other group medical coverage to opt out.
- Enroll or change Flexible Spending Savings Account (FSA)
- Enroll or change optional life insurance or accidental death and dismemberment (AD&D)

MCOLES Compliance Meeting

The District Police Authority recently conducted a Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards (MCOLES) compliance meeting to reconcile law enforcement records, processes and procedures.





A Website Feedback Survey was conducted during the Fall 2015 semester.

The data is used to assist in evaluating and making enhancements to the WCCCD website. The survey, administered online, had a total of 153 respondents. Here are some key findings:

- 92.8% of respondents indicated they found the information they were looking for on the website.
- 83.7% of respondents gave a “Good to Excellent” rating on the content provided on the website.
- 84.3% of respondents gave a “Good to Excellent” rating on the ease of the navigation of the website.
- 75.8% of respondents indicated they would recommend the website to others.

50th Faculty Innovations

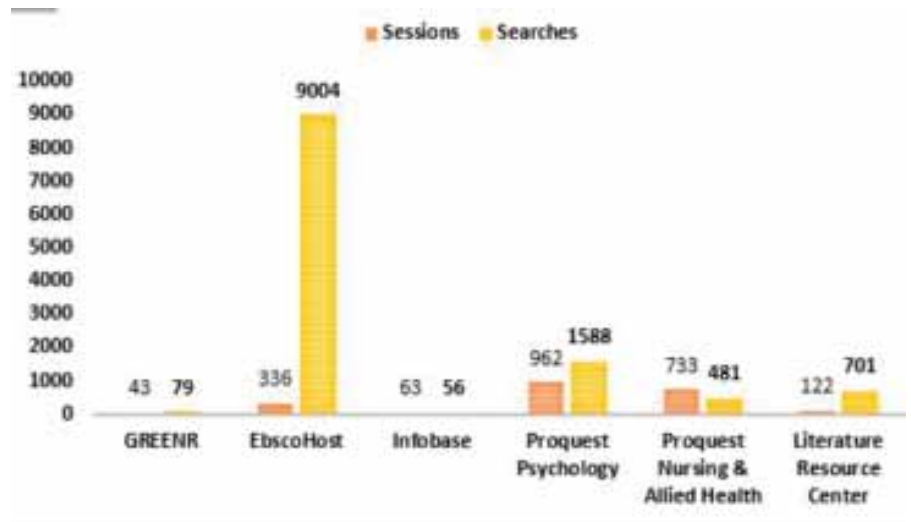

Art Gallery Collaboration

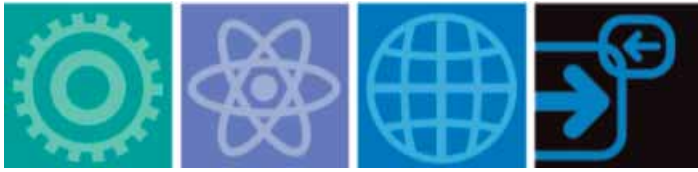

Detroit Department of Transportation Recruitment Fair

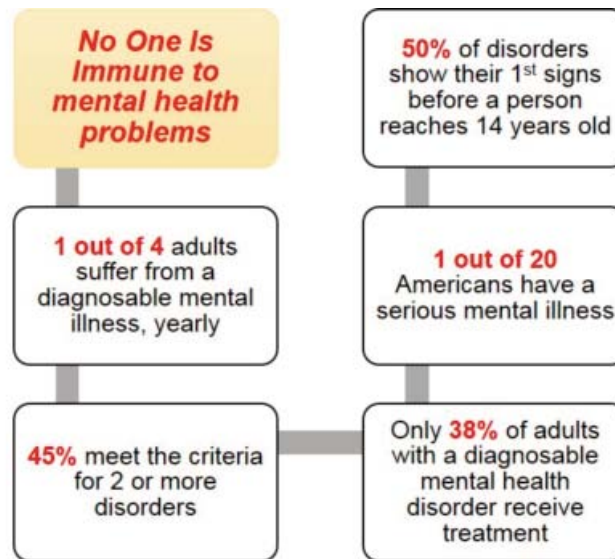
The School of Continuing Education and Workforce Development

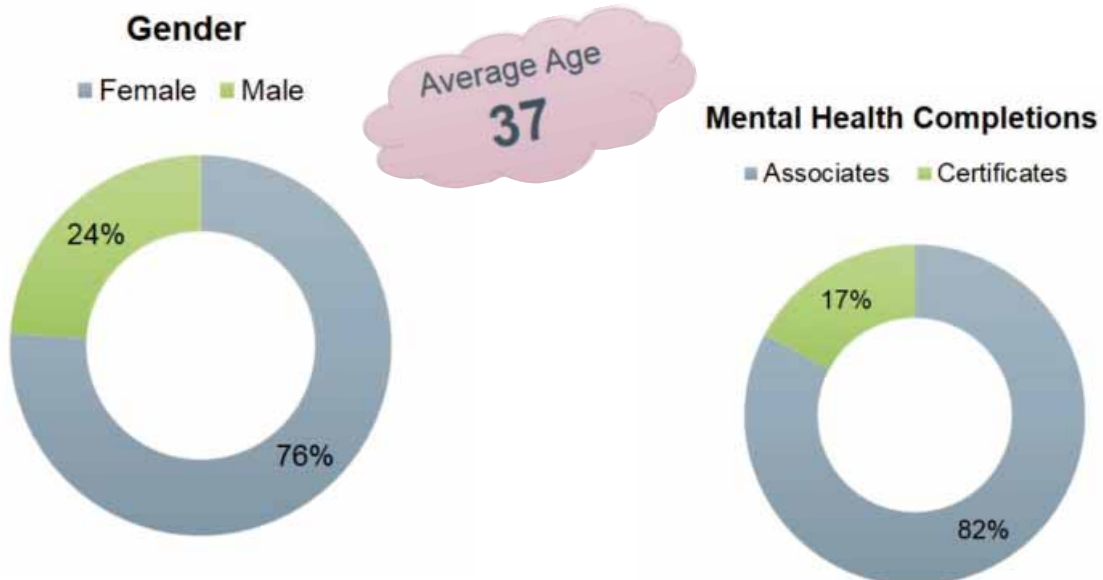


What's Trending in IE: Mental Health

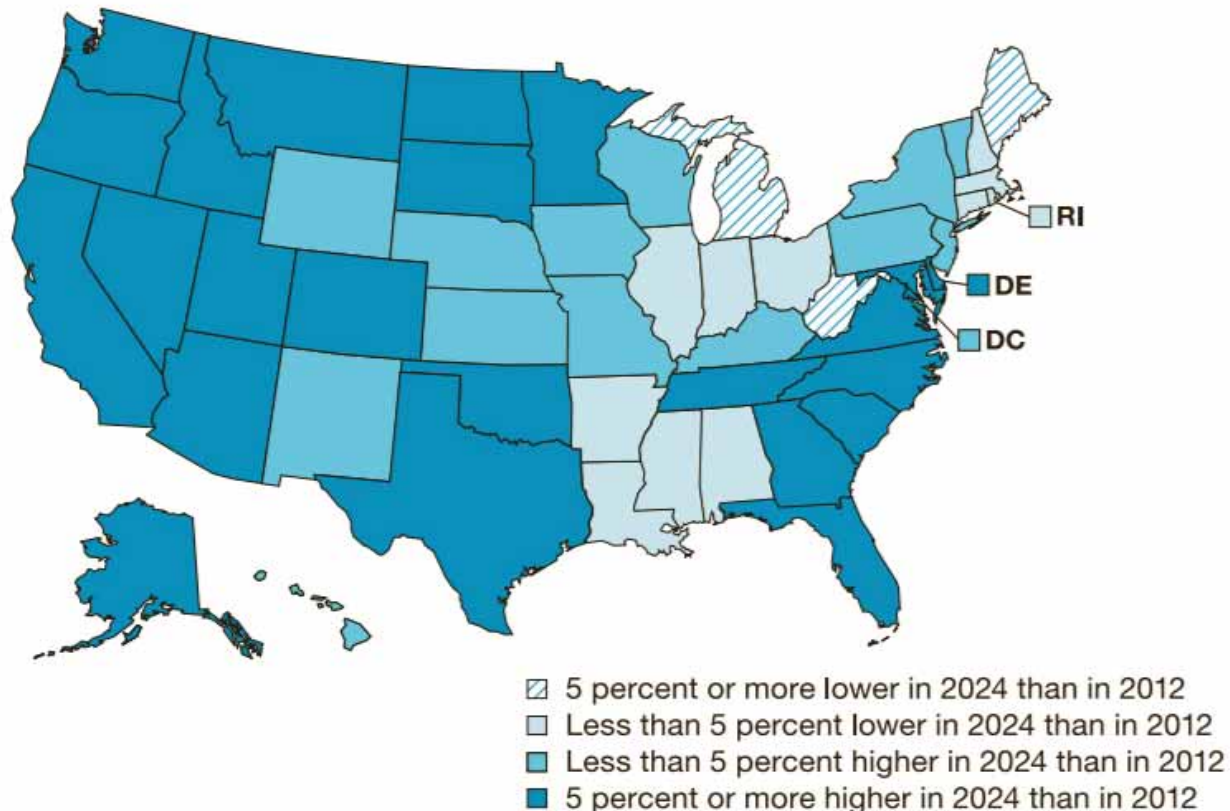


The Mental Health Program is one of the top 20 enrolled programs at WCCCD.

High School Graduates by State

The number in public high school graduates is projected to be higher in 2014-25 than in 2011-12. This plays out differently among the states.

- ❁ High school graduates are projected to be higher in 2024-25 than in 2011-12 for 36 states and the District of Columbia, with projected high school graduates
 - ❁ Five percent or more higher in 28 states; and
 - ❁ Less than five percent higher in eight states and the District of Columbia.
- ❁ High school graduates are projected to be lower in 2024-25 than in 2011-12 for 14 states, with projected high school graduates
 - ❁ Five percent or more lower in 8 states; and
 - ❁ Less than five percent lower in six states.

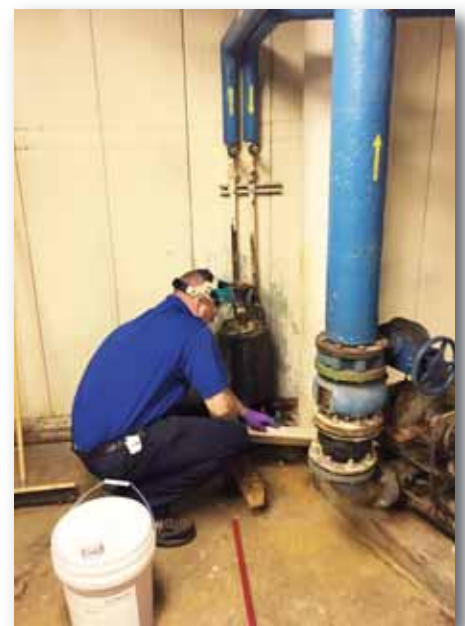
ITI Outreach – Faculty Engagement

Legislative Corner

Center for Student Success Update Academic Program Transfer Partnerships

Michigan Center for Student Success has compiled statewide data on the articulation agreements and on-site baccalaureate degree programs at community colleges. The MCCA has forwarded this list to the Michigan Association of State Universities (MASU) and the Michigan Independent Colleges and Universities (MICU). MASU and MICU will complete the enrollment, course, and completion information. The final report will be submitted to the Legislature on February 1, 2017. In summary:

- There are 257 on-site baccalaureate programs at 20 community colleges with 22 four-year partners. Top partners are Ferris State University (50 programs), Siena Heights University (38 programs), and Wayne State University (23 programs).
- There are 1,659 articulation agreements at 27 community colleges with more than 100 four-year partners. Top partners are Davenport University (466 agreements), Eastern Michigan University (172 agreements), and Ferris State University (111 agreements).

Michigan Colleges Online Top 10 Education Technologies that Will Be Dead and Gone in the Next Decade

The Campus Technology 2016 Teaching with Technology survey released results of the faculty predictions on what technology will not be around in the next 10 years. The list includes: Desktop computers and laptops; clickers; non-interactive projectors and whiteboards; document cameras/overhead projectors; traditional presentation software; interactive whiteboards; CD's and DVD's and their players; current learning management systems; and computer labs and dedicated workstations.

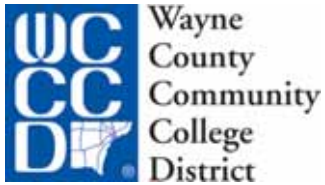
