Financial Aid Workshops for High School Students

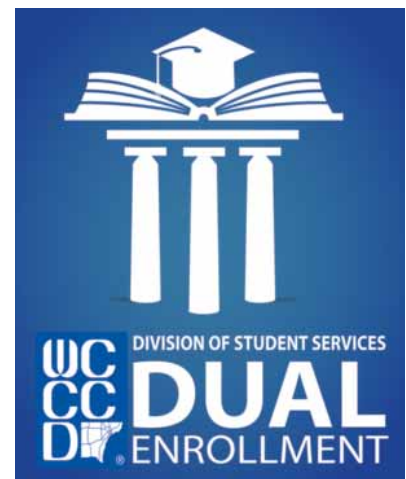

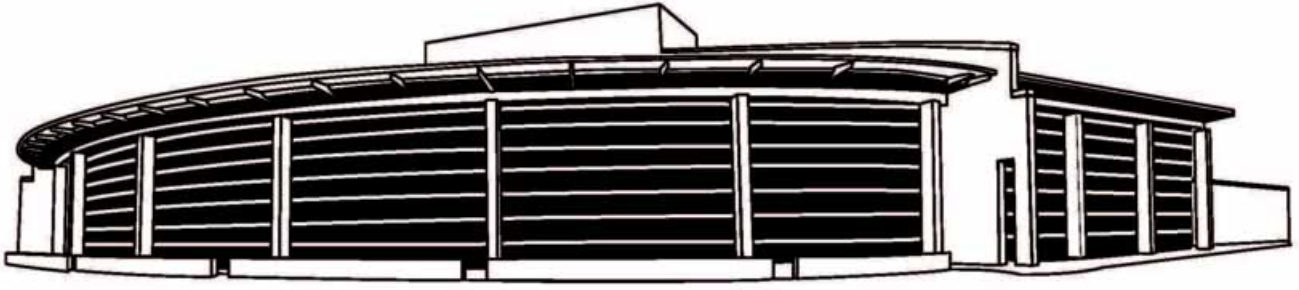
