WCCCD Supports Manufacturing Day!



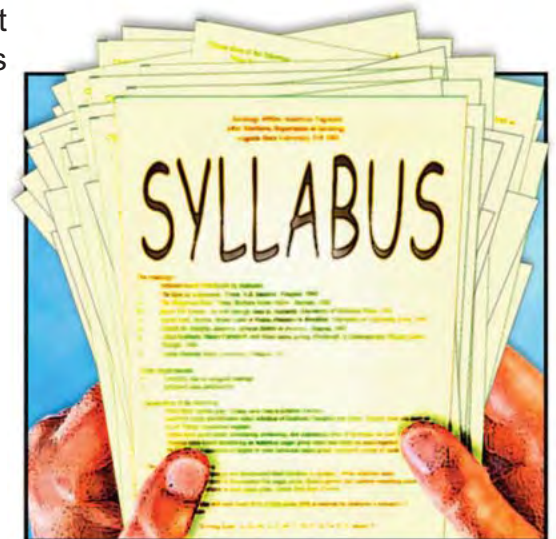

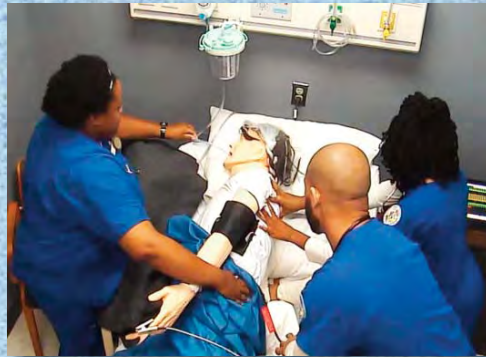
SYLLABUS REVIEW

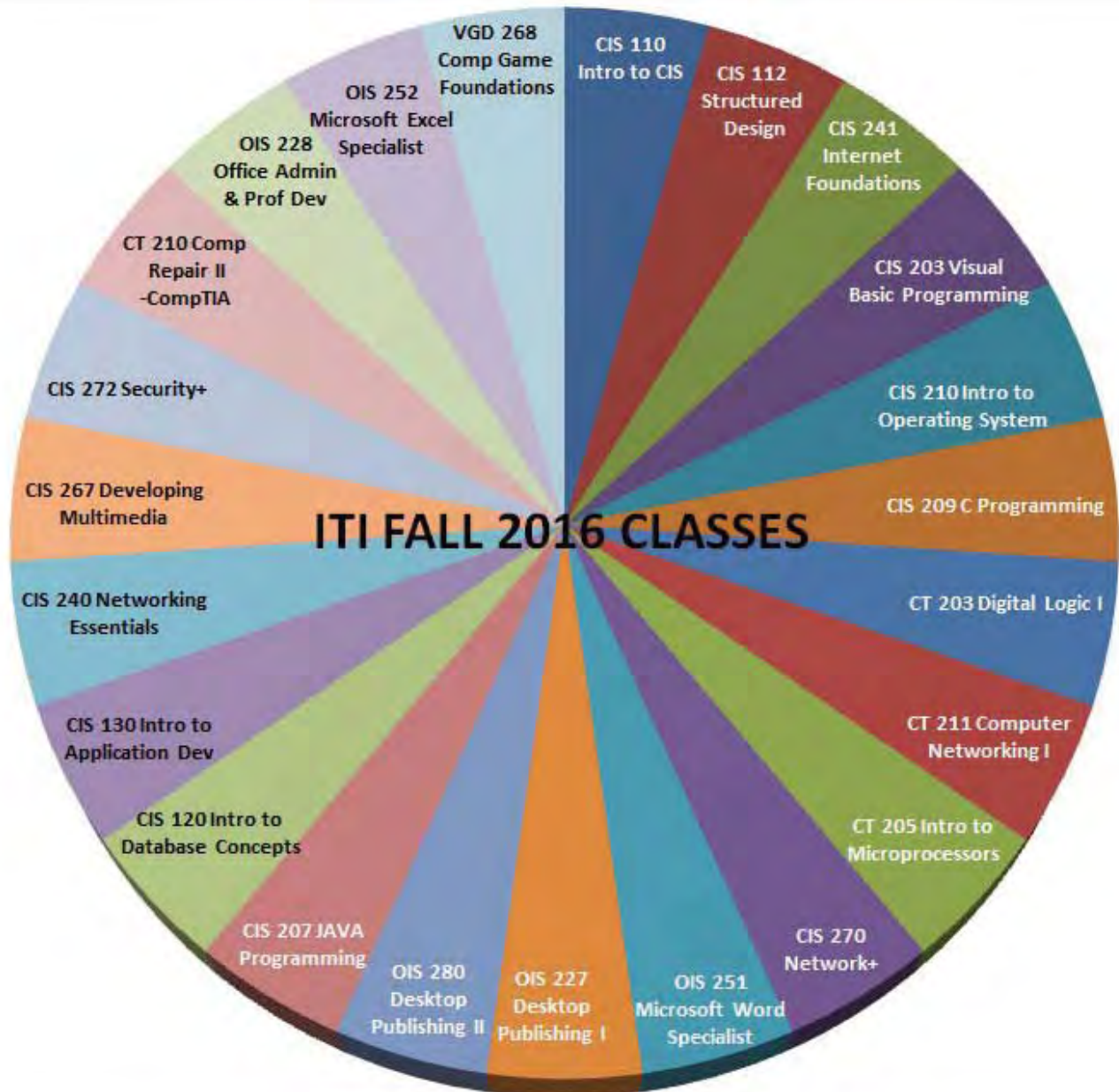

Information Technology Institute



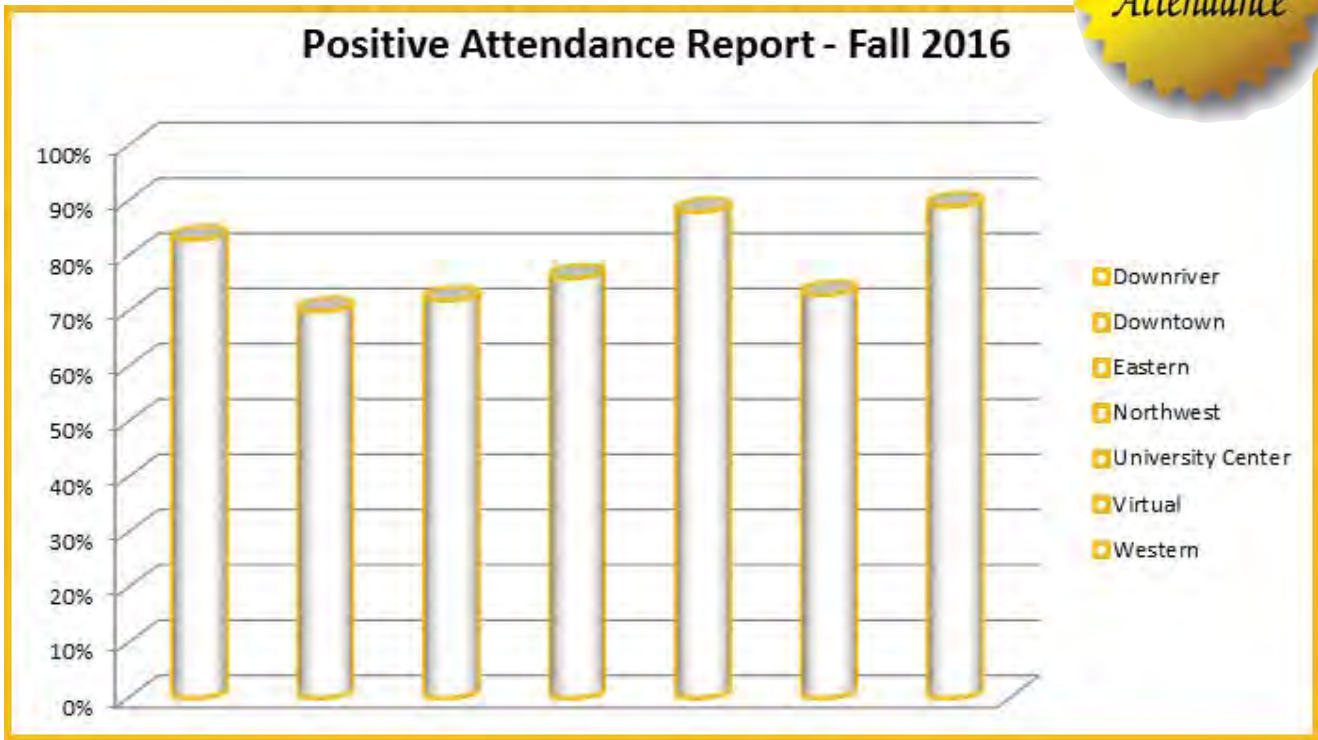
ITI Program Support

Bursar's Office Update

The District Financial Aid Office issues financial aid funds to student's account

The Bursar office audits disbursements and forwards to BankMobile within 14 days of issuance

BankMobile receives funds and releases them based on the student's selected preference

Students receive their funds from BankMobile within the following timelines (based on their refund preference)

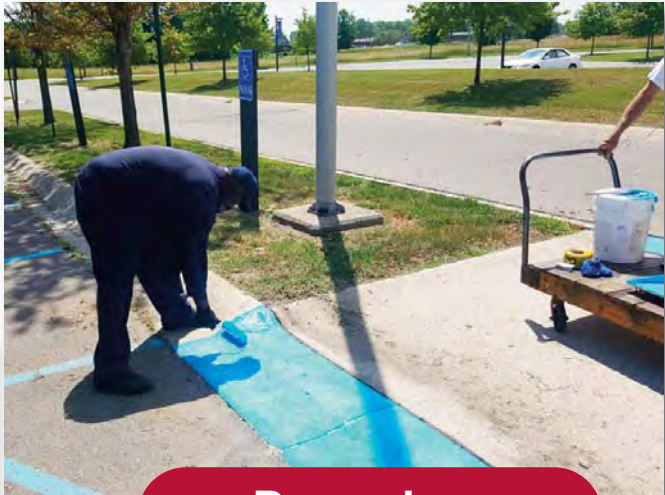
BankMobile Account – funds deposited same day funds are sent by WCCCD

Direct Deposit – funds deposited in 2-3 business days

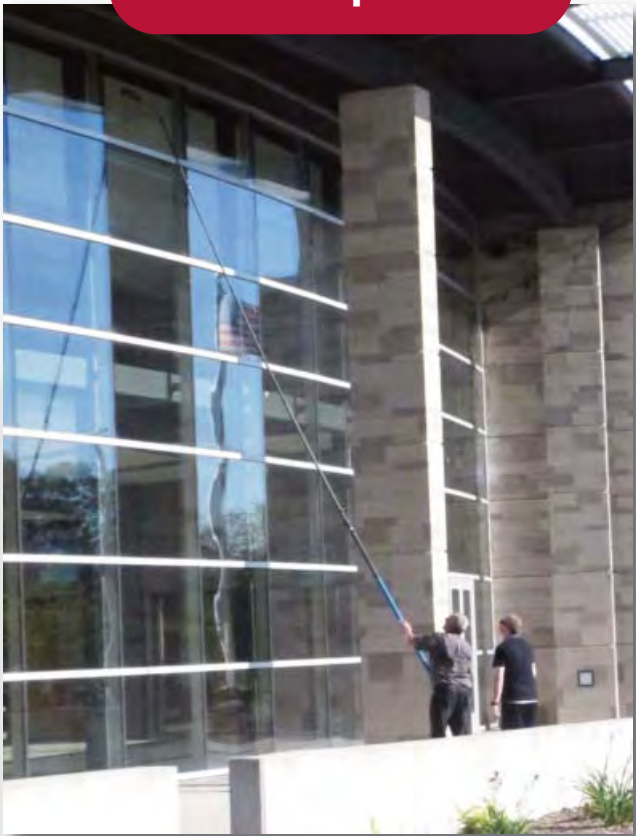
Paper Check – funds received in 5-7 business days

The Bursar's Office will soon begin issuing the Fall 2016 financial aid refunds. Once the disbursements are audited, the District partners with BankMobile to issue financial aid residual refunds to students based on their elected refund preference. Students can choose to have their refund delivered to their established BankMobile Account, direct deposit to another financial institution, or via paper check.

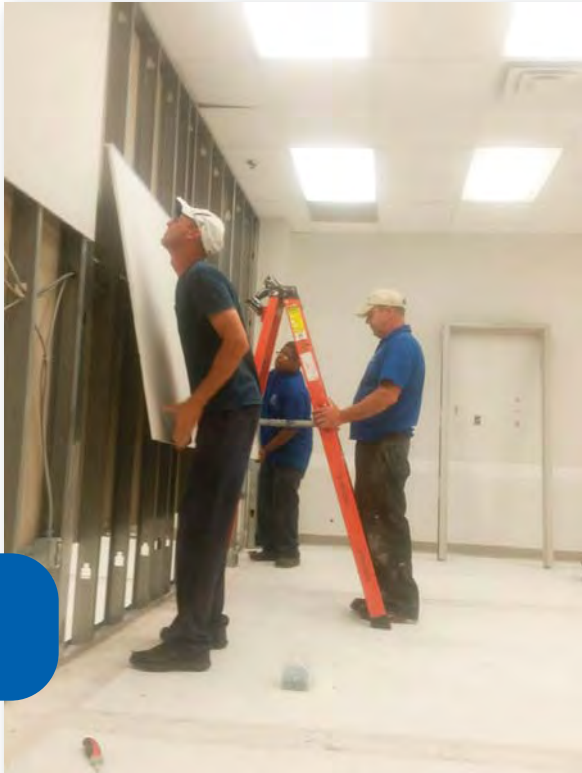

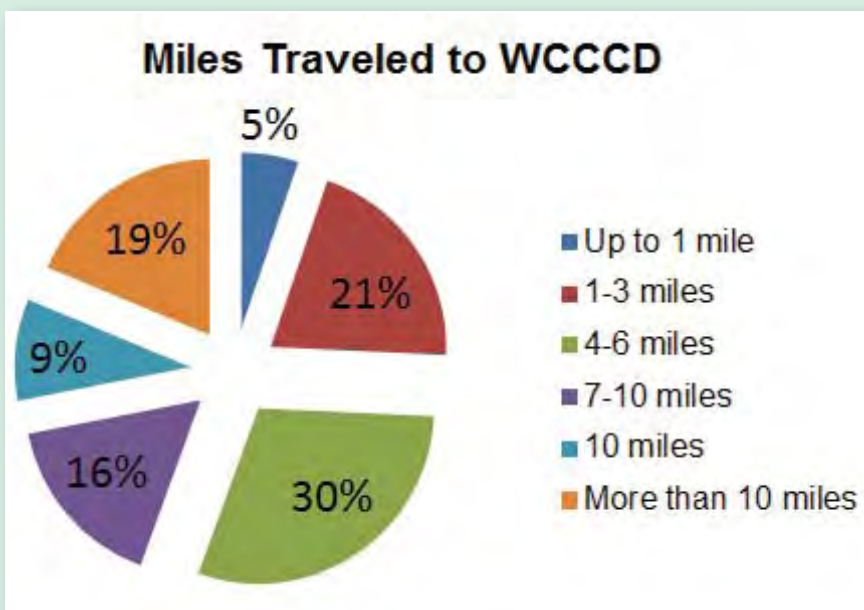

Factors That Influence Community College Attendance

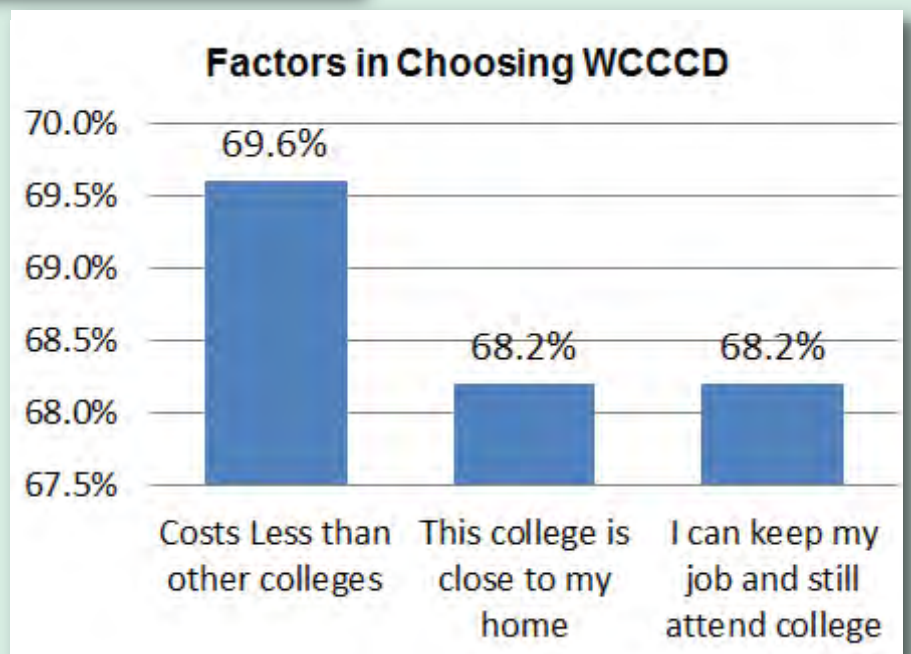

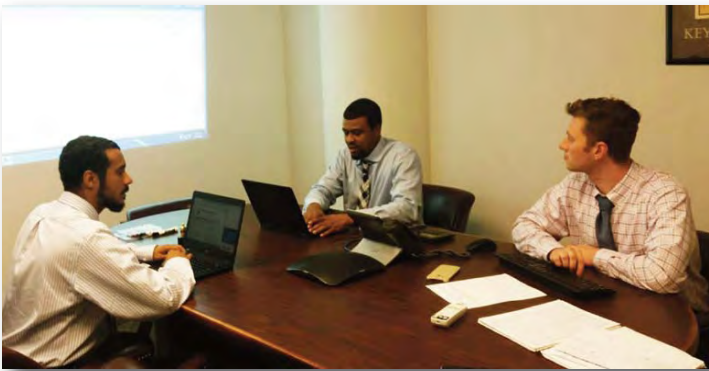
Weekly Update

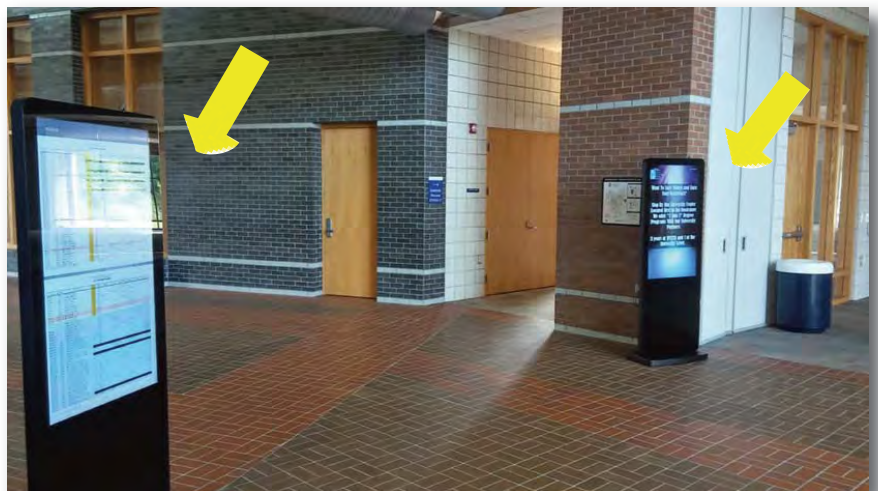
Currently, the team is meeting to address the following:

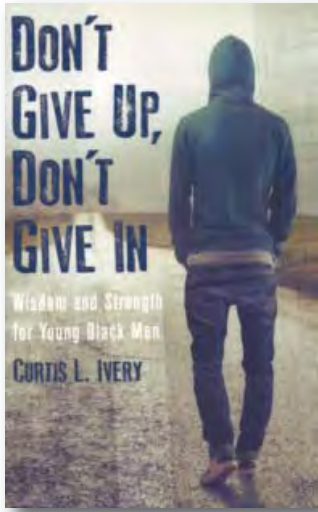

Continuing education classes are in full swing at the Northwest Campus. The Sewing and Design class were eager to show their excitement for learning new skills.

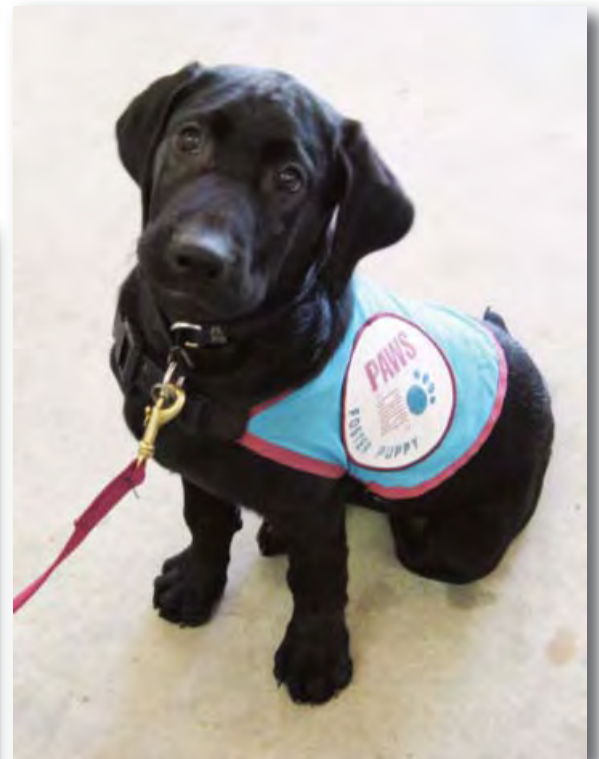
