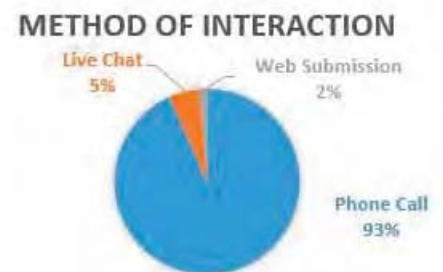
Career Programs

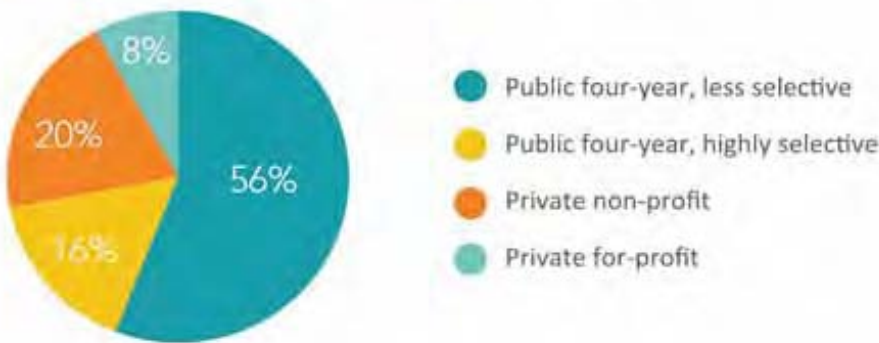


Distance Learning

Community college transfer students



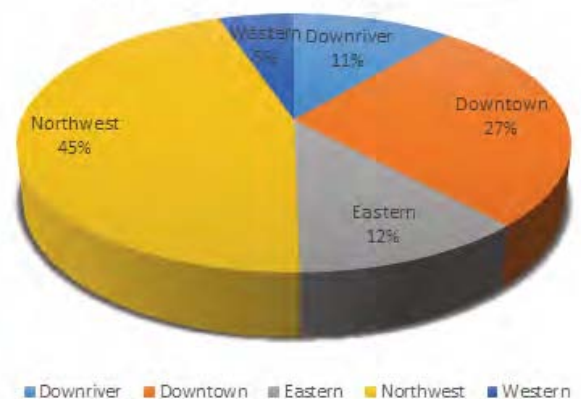
Transfer Programs

According to Kent Community College Research Center, Teacher's College, and Columbia University the majority of community college students who transfer to four-year institutions transfer to public institutions.

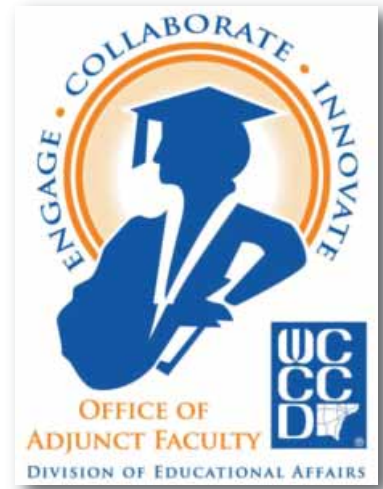
Learning Resource Centers

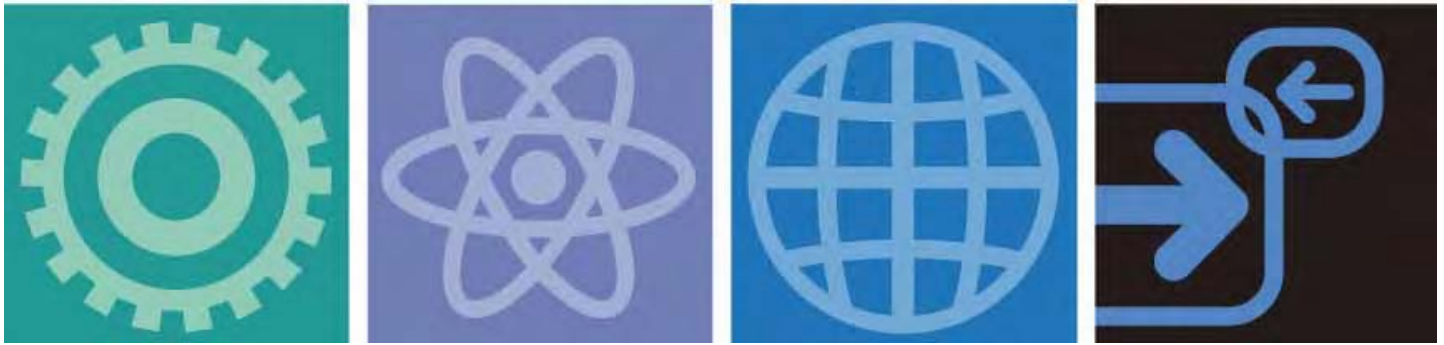
Fire Tactics Training

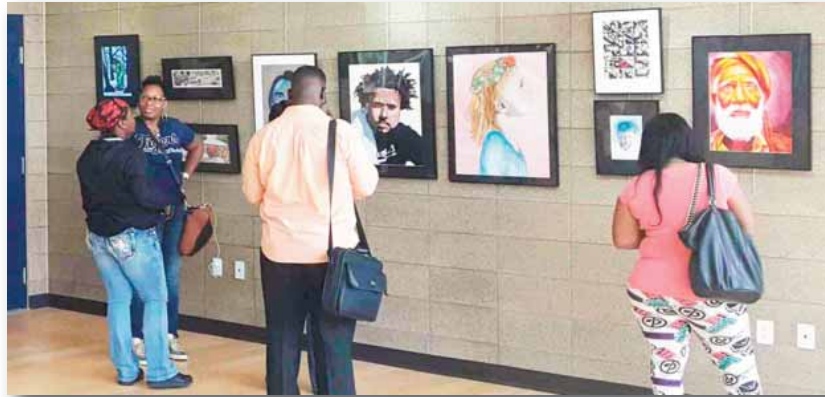

The Phillip House Mission hosted its annual Sickle Cell Awareness Health and Homeless Fair for the homeless and families with special needs.

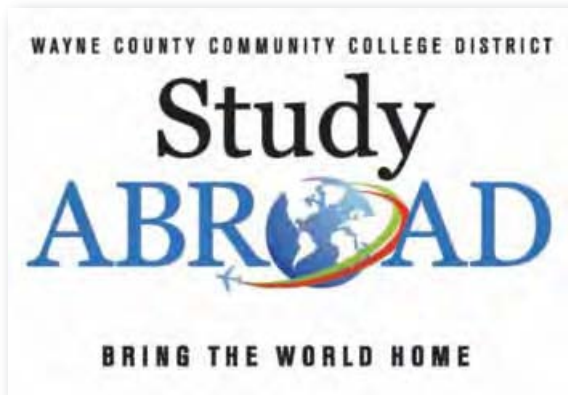
Welcome Day at the Northwest Campus!
