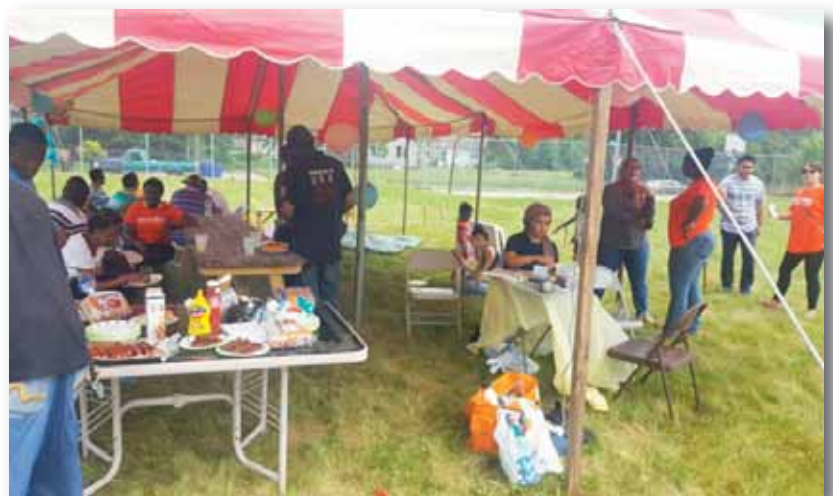


International Programs and Global Partnerships

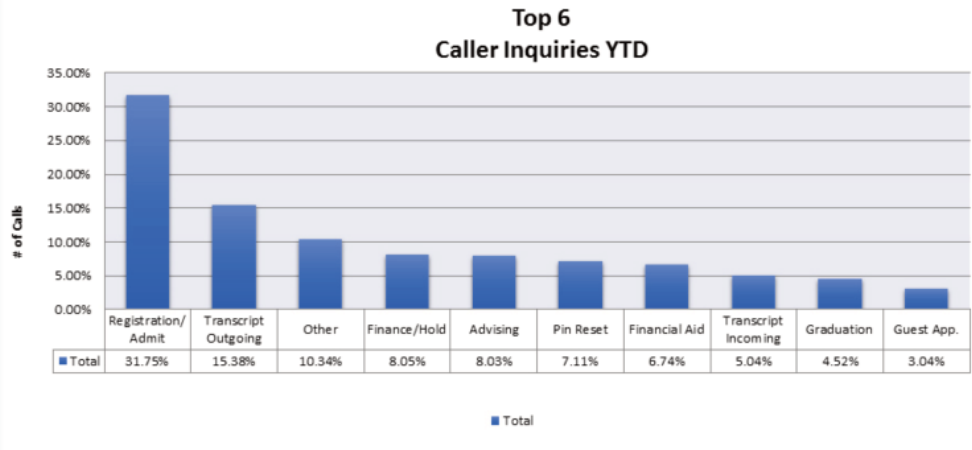
The District Command Center is Up and Running for Fall 2017 Registration!

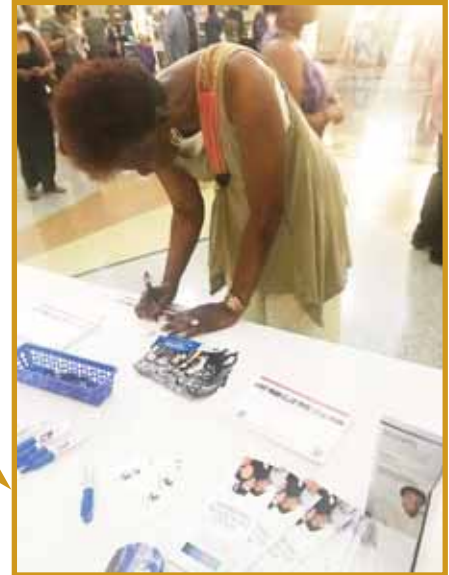

Residents at the Parkview Towers Senior Living facility received information on tracing their ancestors and how to record their own stories. They were excited and have requested additional sessions.

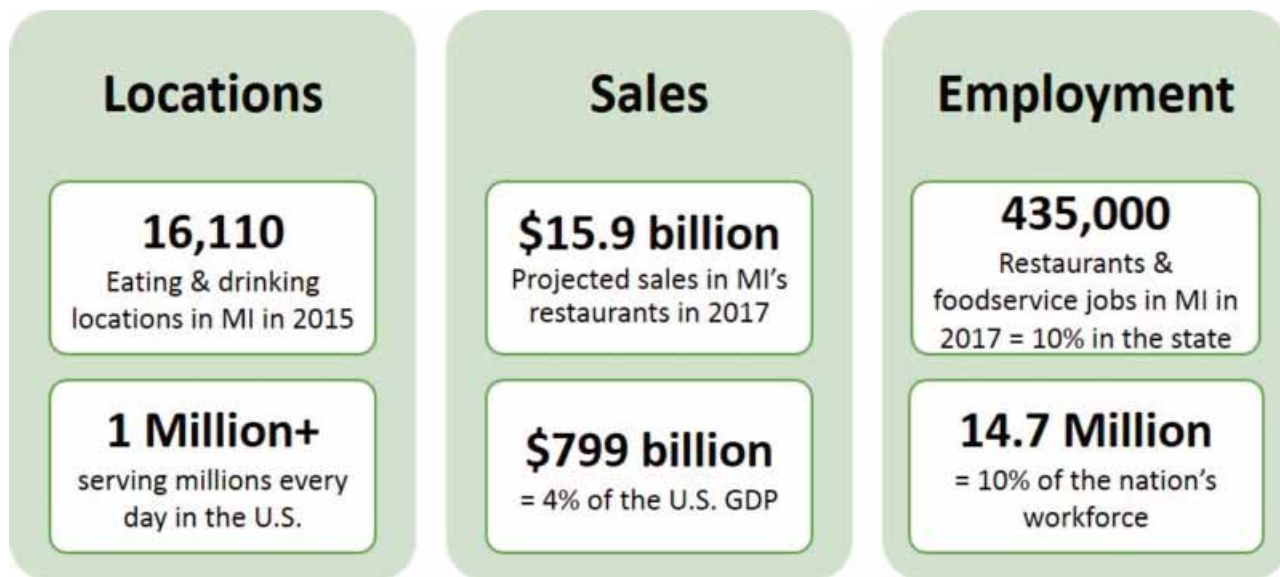

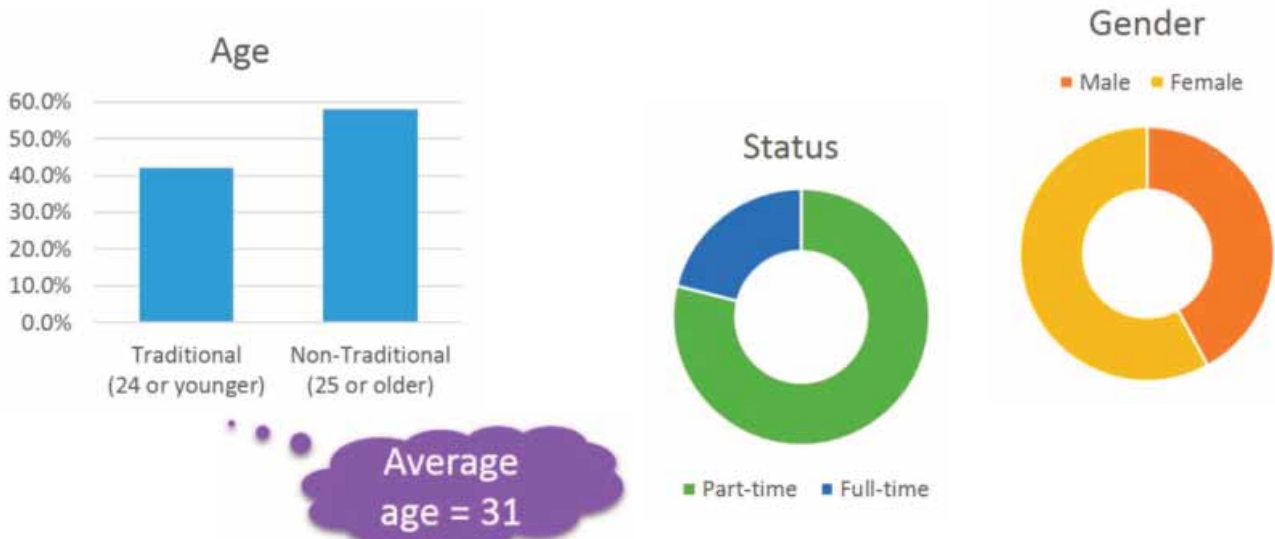

Faculty Roundtable

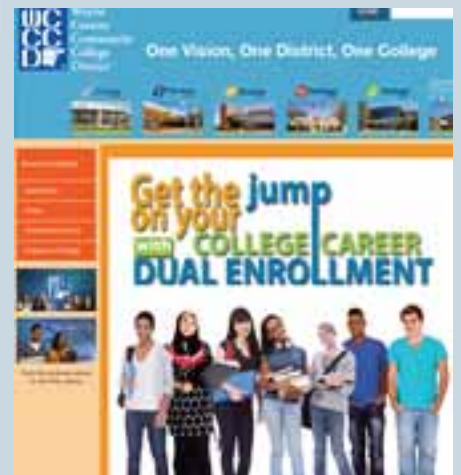
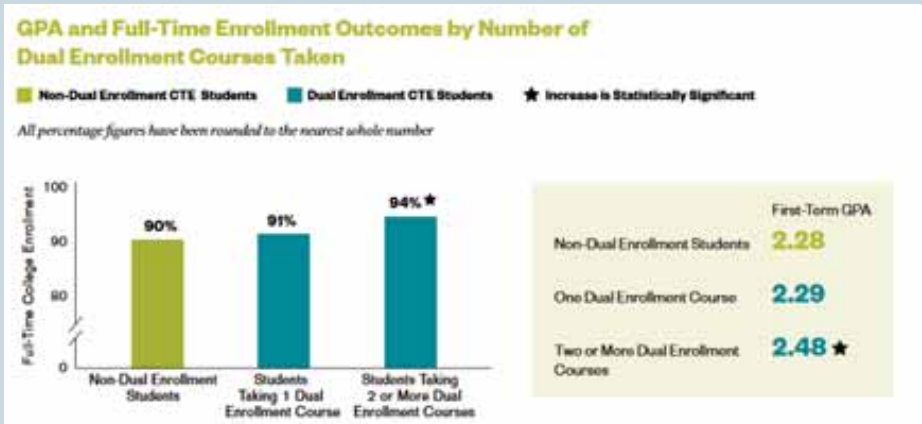
The Faculty Roundtable Role in Criterion 5: *The institutions governance and administrative structures promote effective leadership and support collaborate processes that enable the institution to fulfill its mission.*

The Faculty Roundtable, comprised of full-time faculty discipline leads, is a forum to discuss academic and educational matters pertaining to the District. Study Supports Dual Enrollment Leads to Improved College Outcomes for High School Students

A study conducted by the Community College Research Center (CCRC), found that dual enrollment participation is positively related to a range of college outcomes, including college enrollment and persistence, greater credit accumulation and higher college GPA. The District is looking to expand career offerings in Auto Service Technology, Allied Health, and Robotics to our high school dual enrollment partners.

- ◆ Amplify student engagement

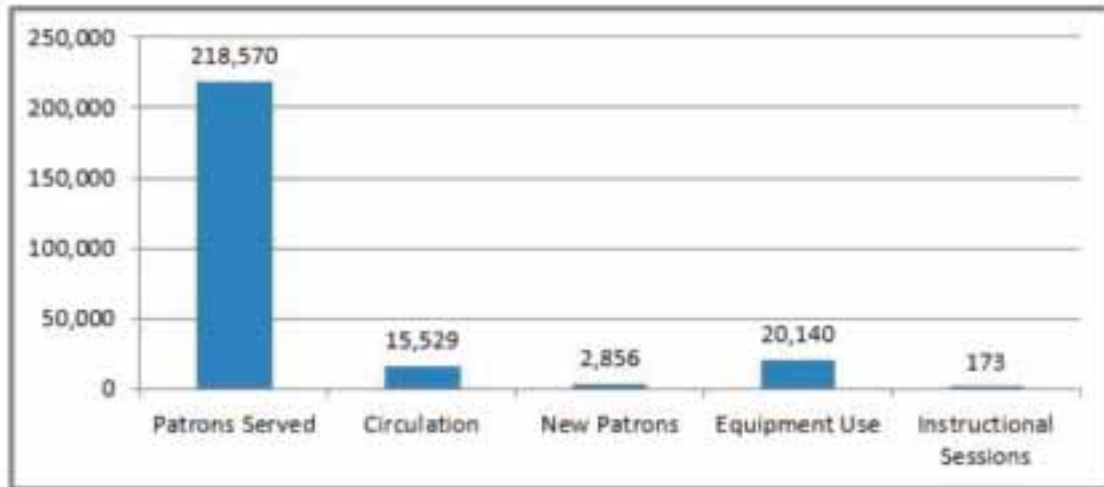

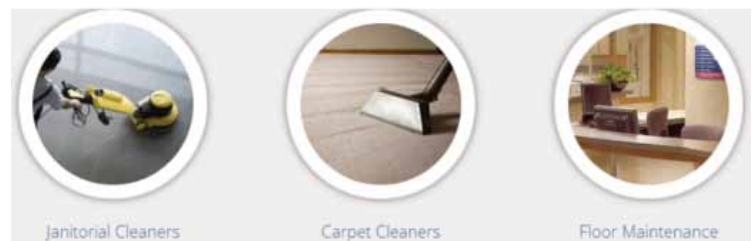

- Custodial work locations

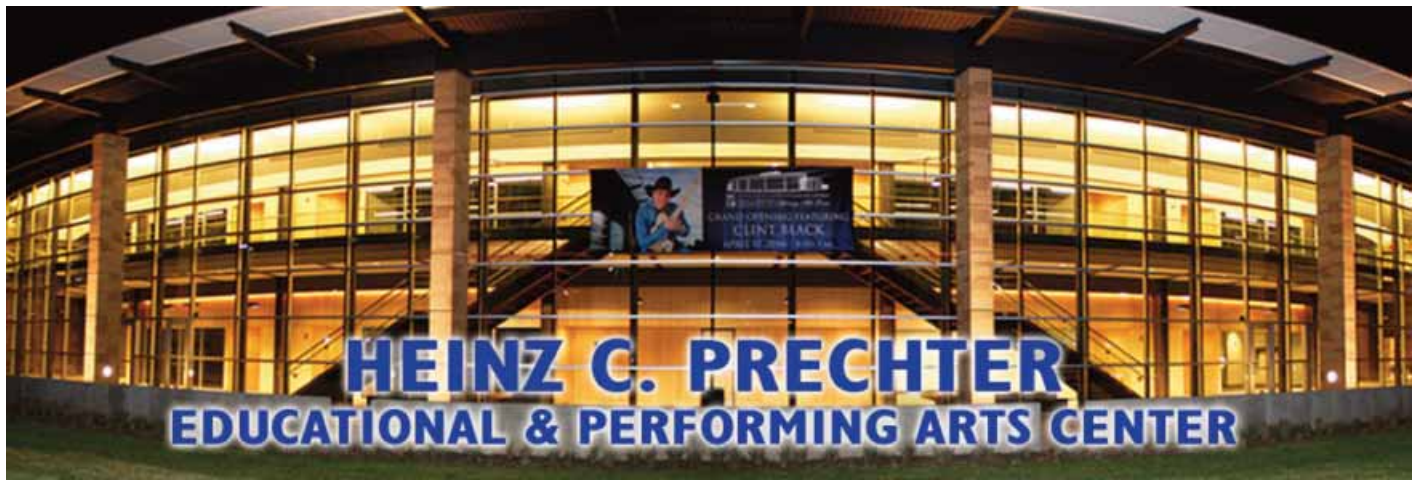
