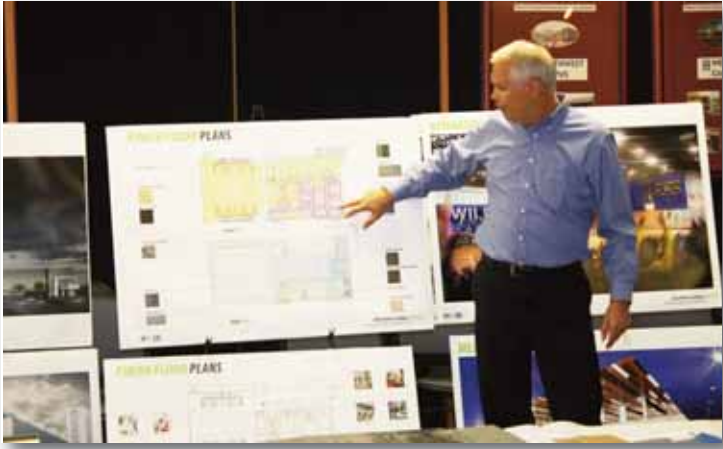

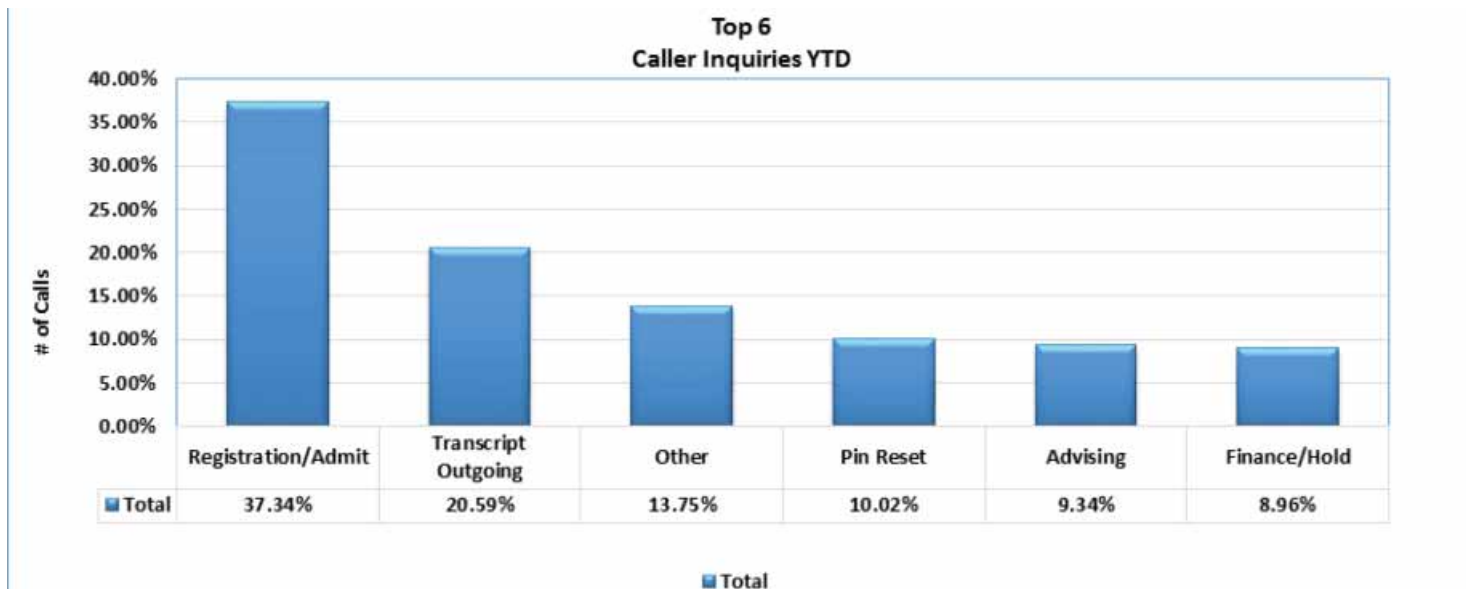
The Student Success Center is committed to providing our students with resources, services and programs that can help them succeed both in and out of the classroom.

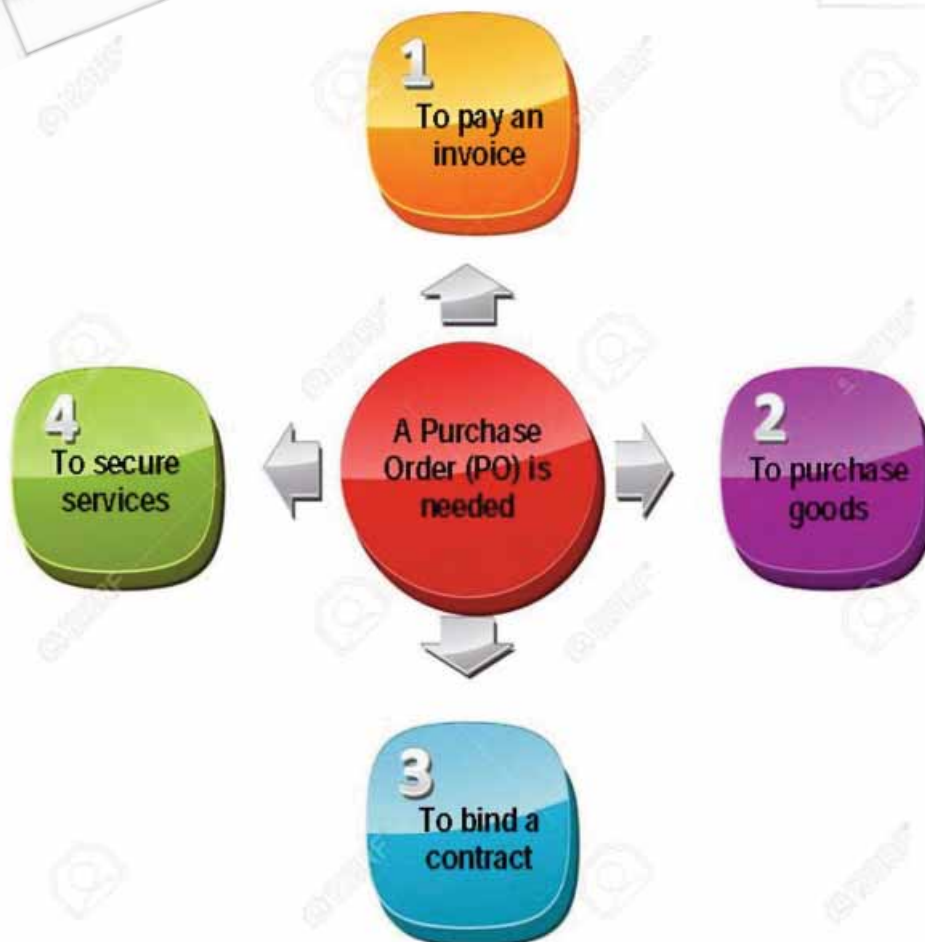

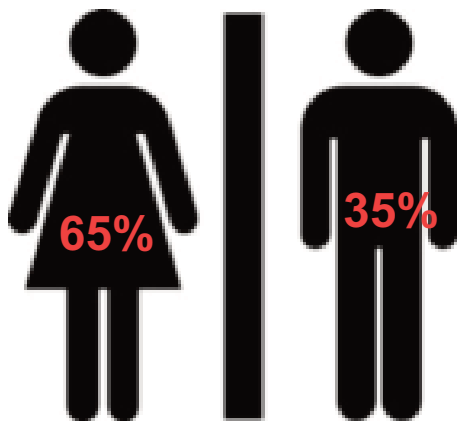

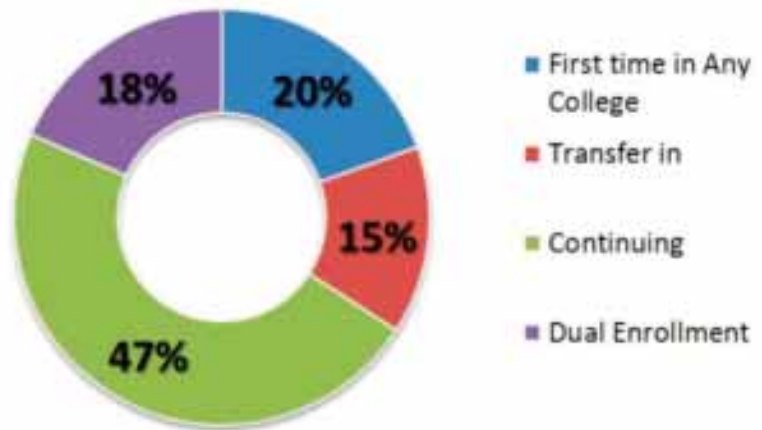

Curriculum Committee

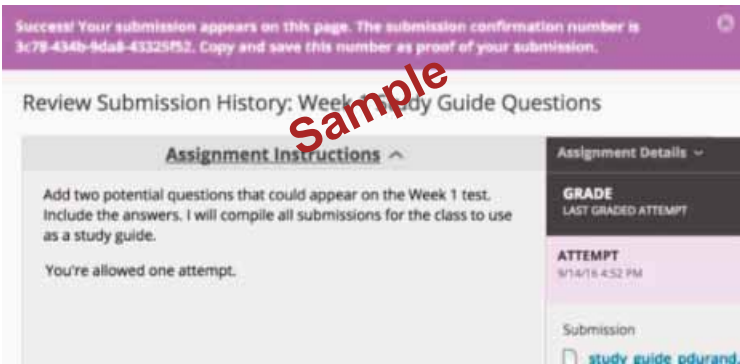
The Curriculum Committee aids in overseeing the quality of educational programs across the District by providing guidance in:

- ❖ Provide a forum for review and discussion of best practices and implementation in assessment and learning, student learning outcomes, etc.



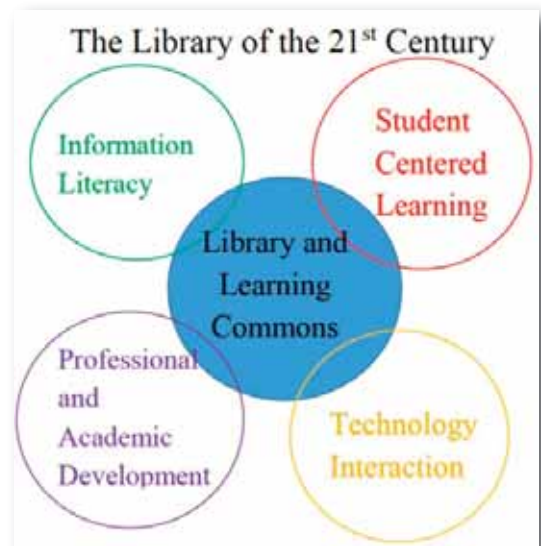

3. Respond to the dynamic educational needs of our students and promote global competence.

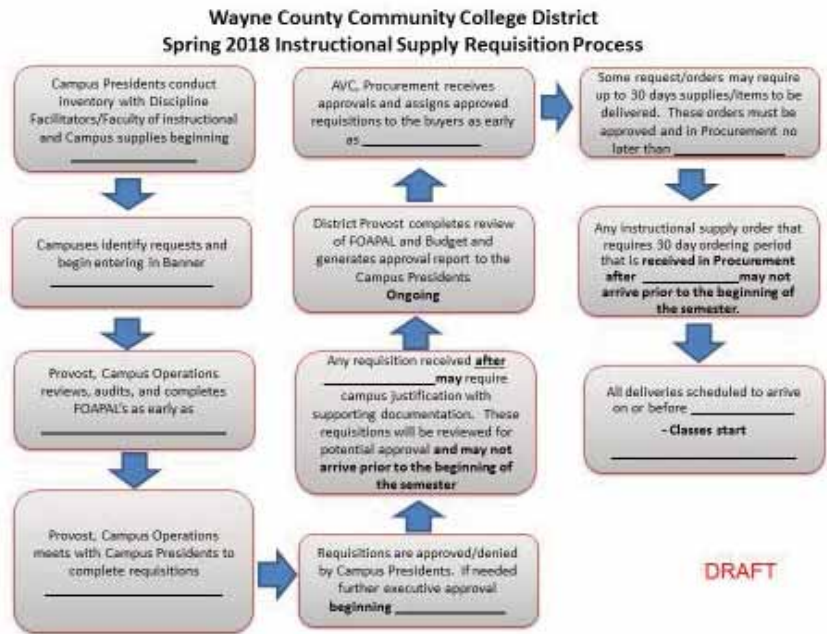

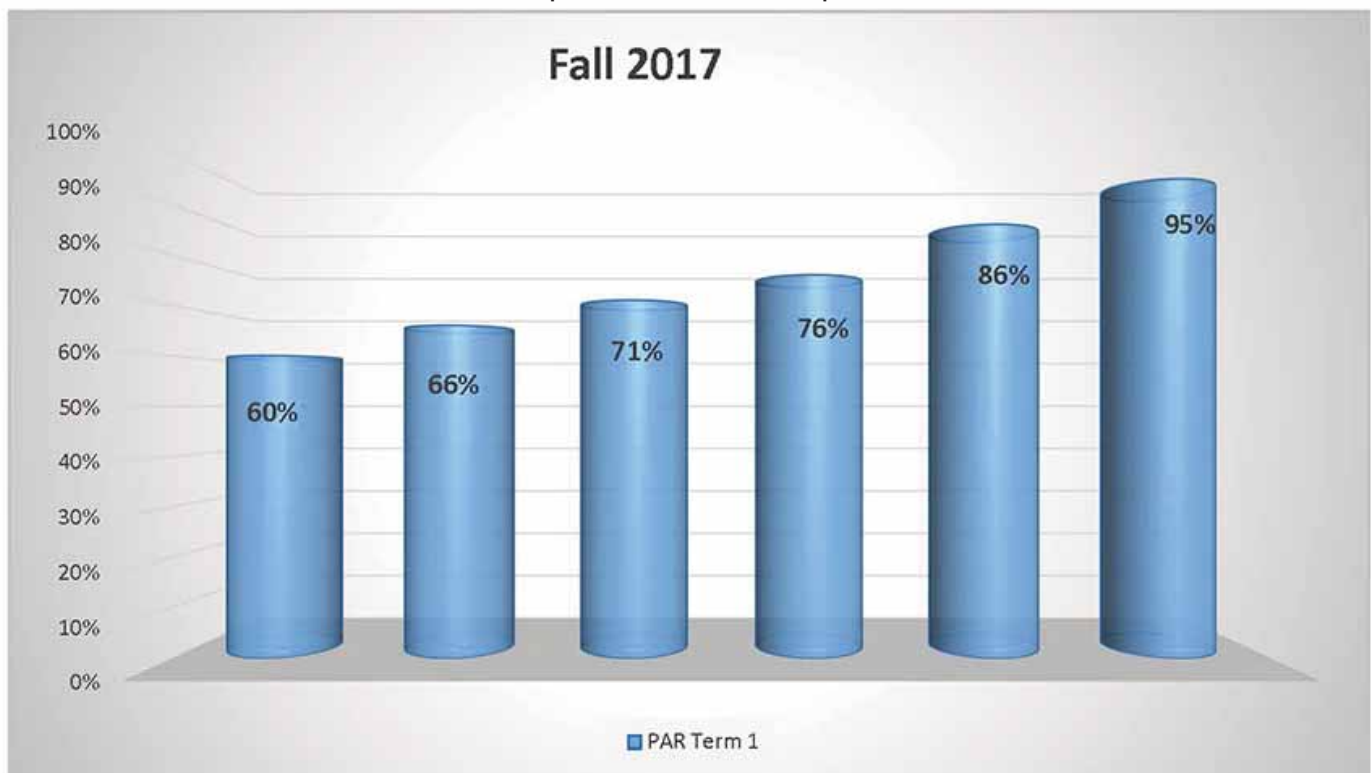
Spring 2018 Instructional Supply Process and Review

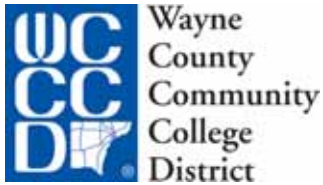
