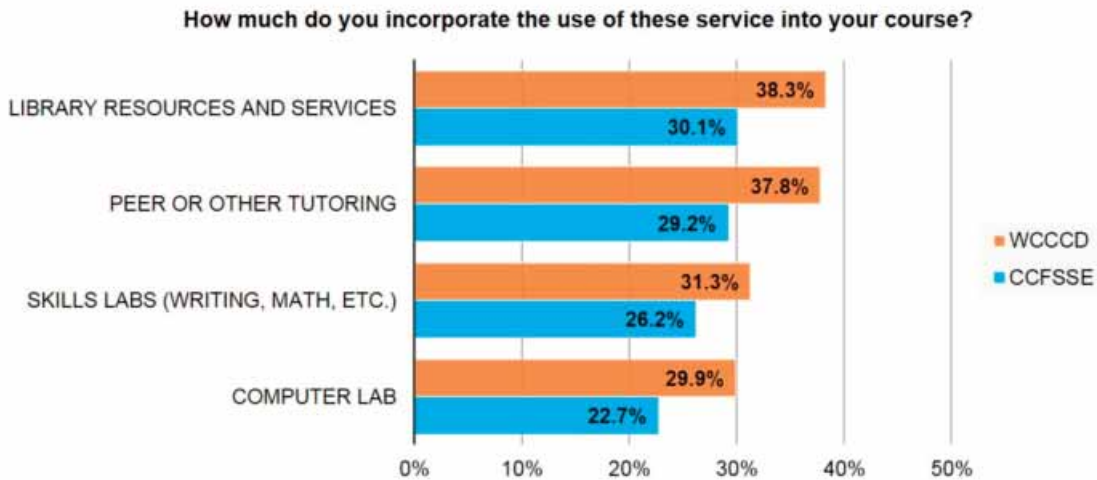

Faculty Experiences and Student Engagement Research

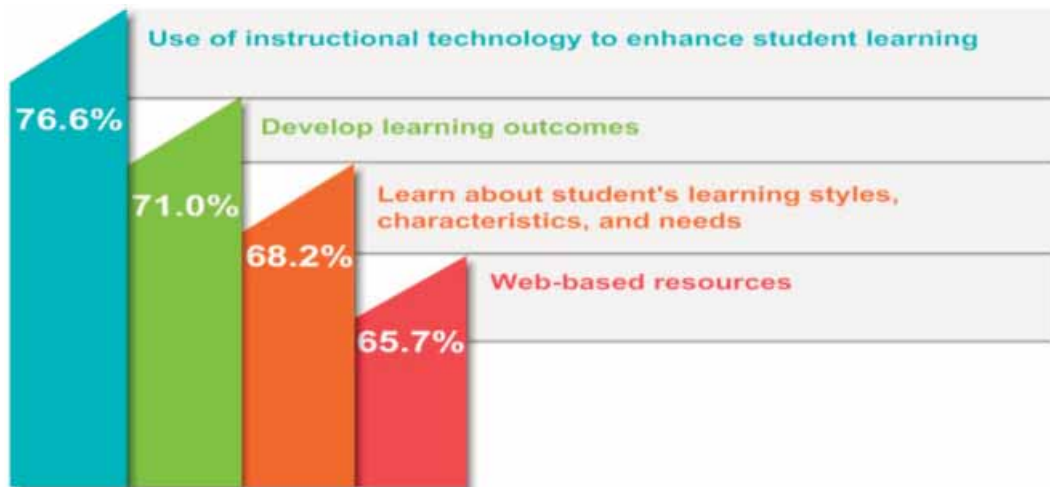

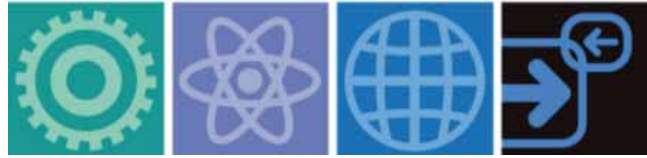

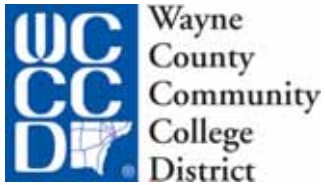
