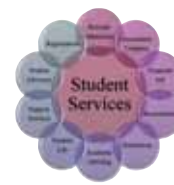


## Spectrum of Care: Autism Resource Fair

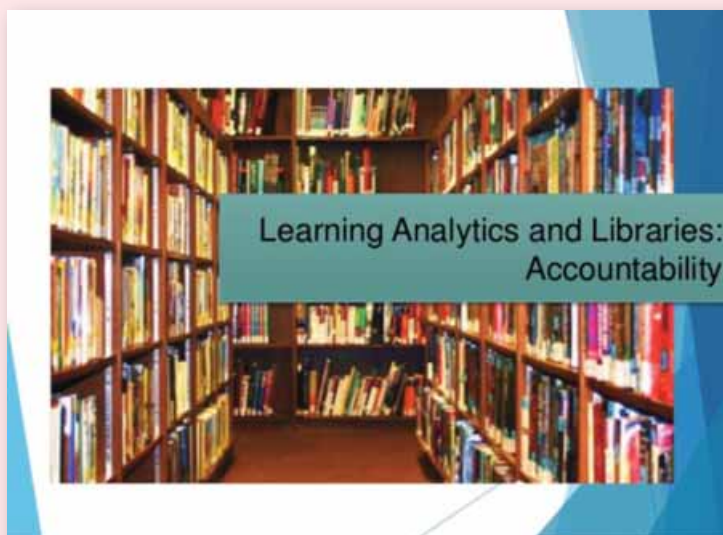
## Distance Learning

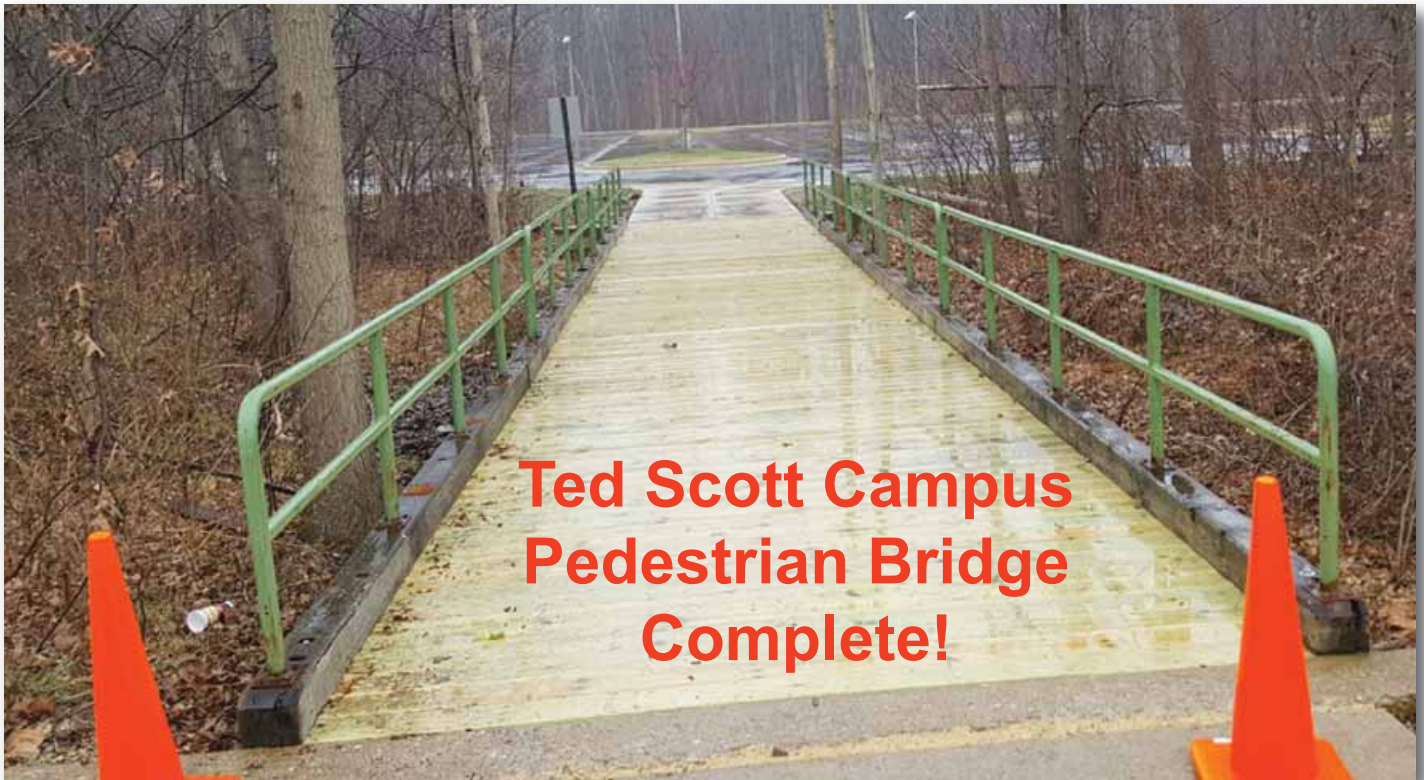

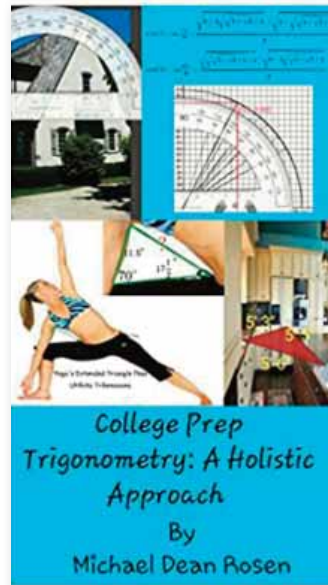
## Grosse Pointe Public Schools Seminar

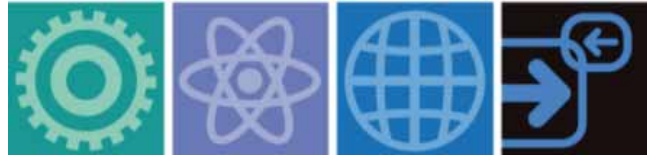

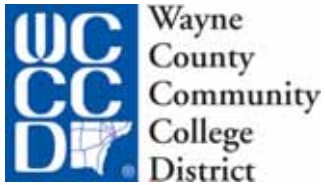
