These state-wide organizations inform the community college reporting, definitions, and resources needed to support colleges in efficient and consistent external reporting to federal and state governing agencies.

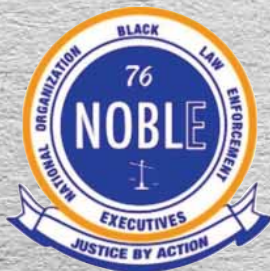


District Police Authority

Staff from the Information Technology Institute attended Sisters Code's Kick-Off Celebration of their first Meet-Up Group in Detroit.

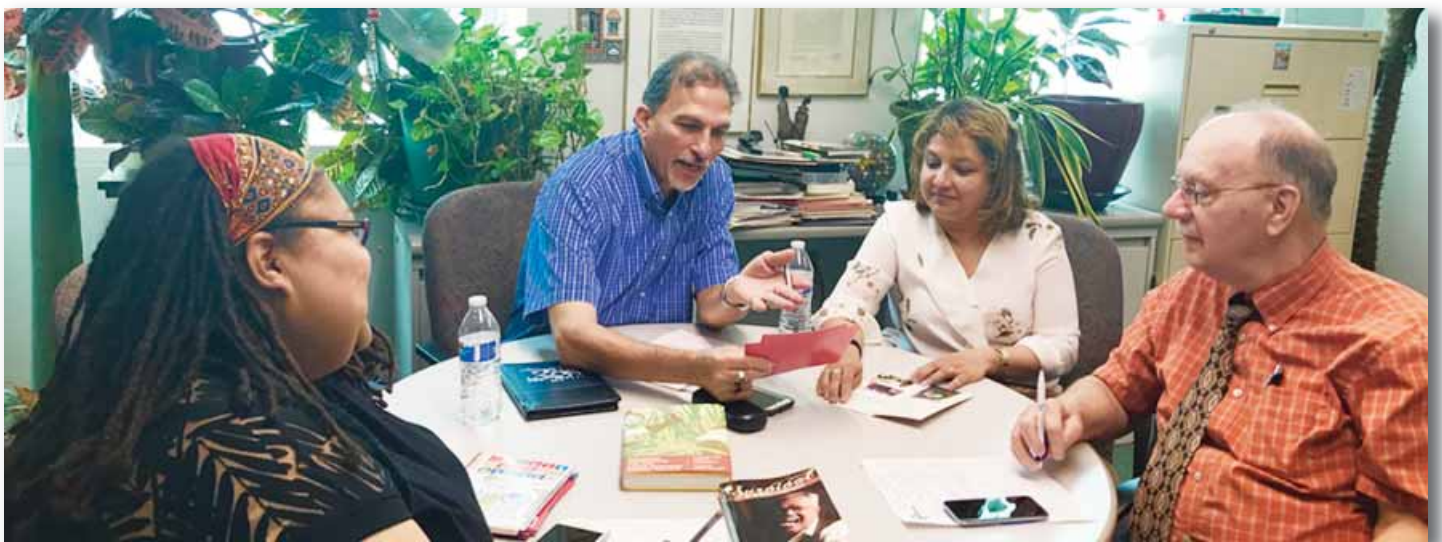

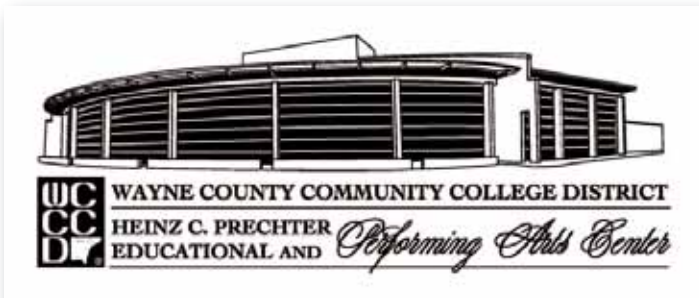


The Northwest Campus hosted the Sounds of Summer Hip Hop Neighborhood concert. The concert showcased various young artists from the community.

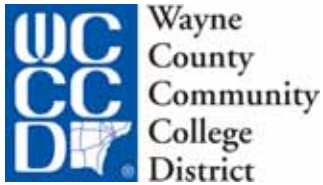
