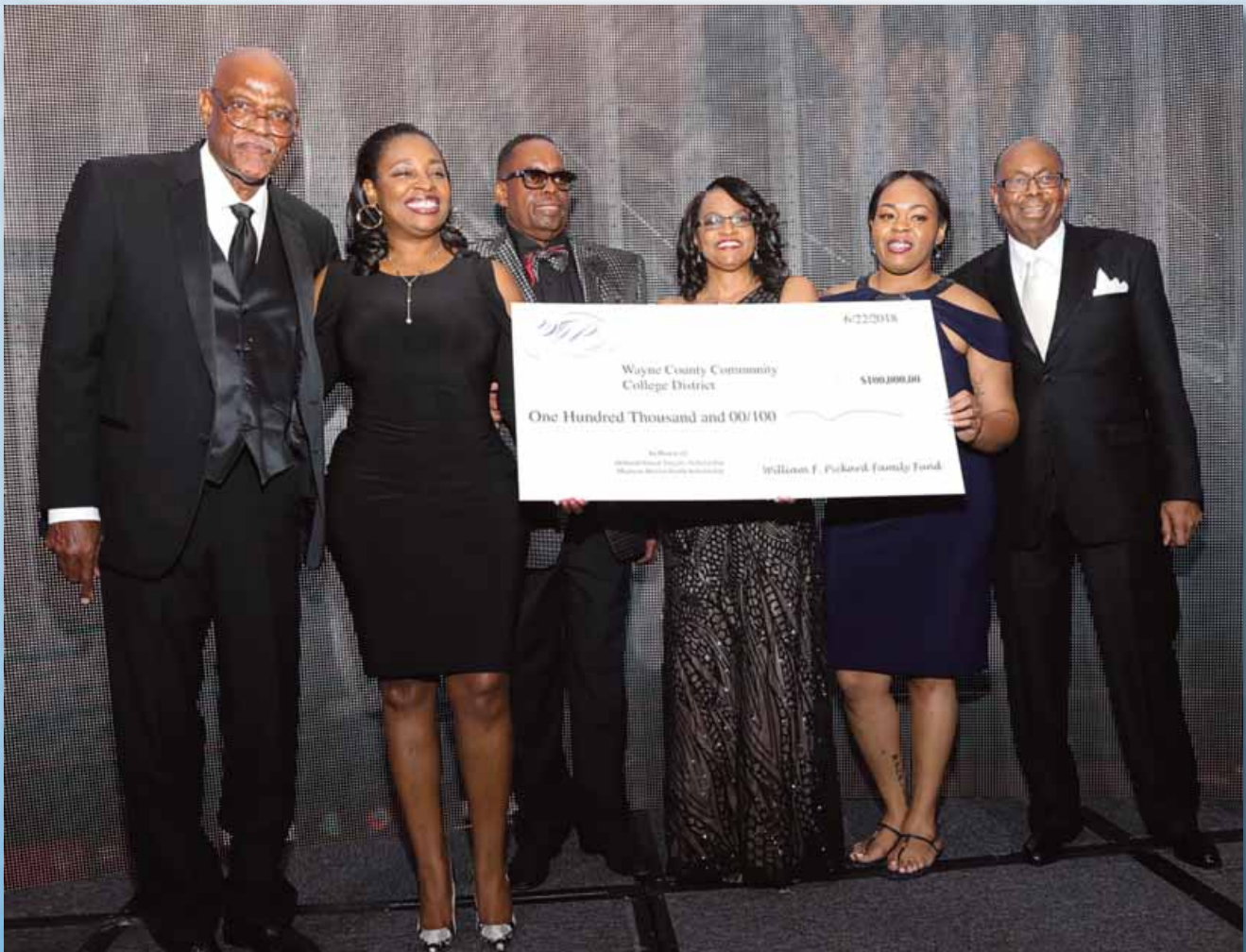






## Thank you Dr. William Pickard!

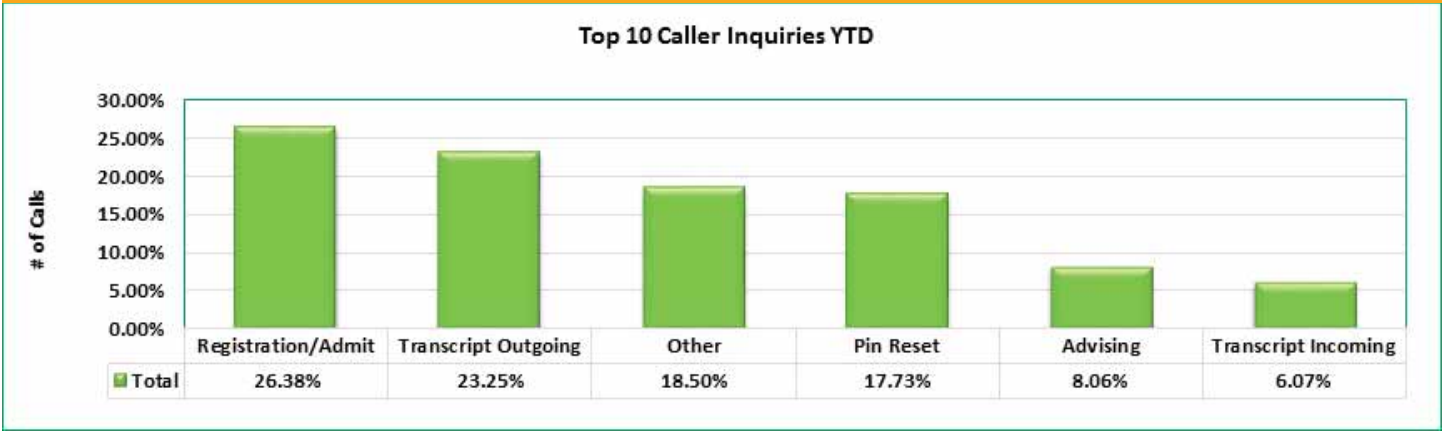

The Division of Human Resources recognizes the importance of being in compliance with the Federal Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA). The District provides family/medical leave to eligible employees requiring unpaid time off for qualified medical and family reasons. The District works with FMLA source, a third-party administrator, to ensure all leaves are FMLA compliant



## Faculty Assignment Audit and Reconciliation

In preparation for faculty payroll for Fall 2018, the Division of Human Resources, with the assistance from the campus presidents and the Division of Administration and Finance are conducting a comprehensive faculty assignment audit. The team reviewed all assignments for qualifications, seniority, credentials, location, signatures, and approvals. This process is a critical protocol towards assuring that we are transparent and compliant.





# Office of Accountability and Transparency

## *Continuous Quality Improvement*



The Continuous Quality Improvement Audit Center collects, reviews and conducts monthly reconciliations and on-going audits of all District data. A systematic approach is used to procure data from multiple sources, allowing for collective knowledge through accountability and transparency.

## Campus Staff and Faculty Leave Alignment

The Office of Accountability and Transparency is collecting daily, weekly, and monthly data to analyze and reconcile staff and faculty alignment at each campus location.

At the end of each month, the data will be audited against documentation received by the Divisions of Educational Affairs and Human Resources.

Mike Dotson met with Paul Henning, Director of the Belleville Area Chamber of Commerce to make plans for a series of professional development workshops for local business owners and leaders.

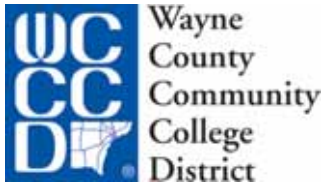


## Paws with a Cause
