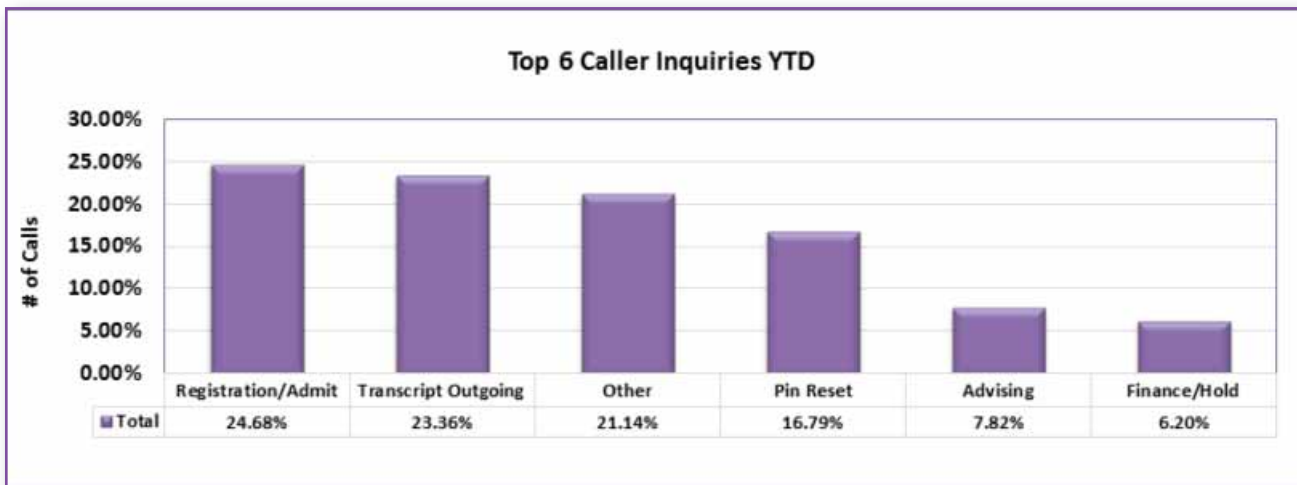

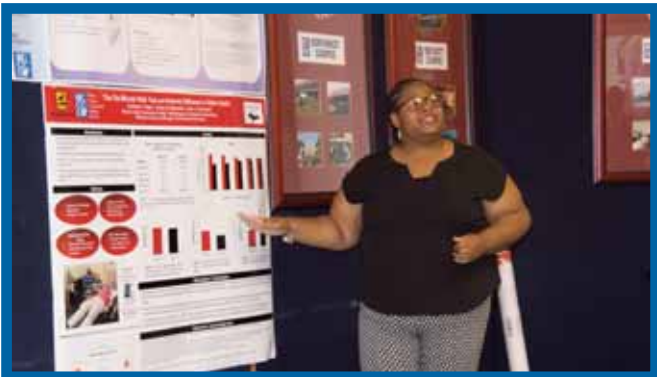
The District Student Success Center specialists reached out to students reminding them to register for Fall 2018.

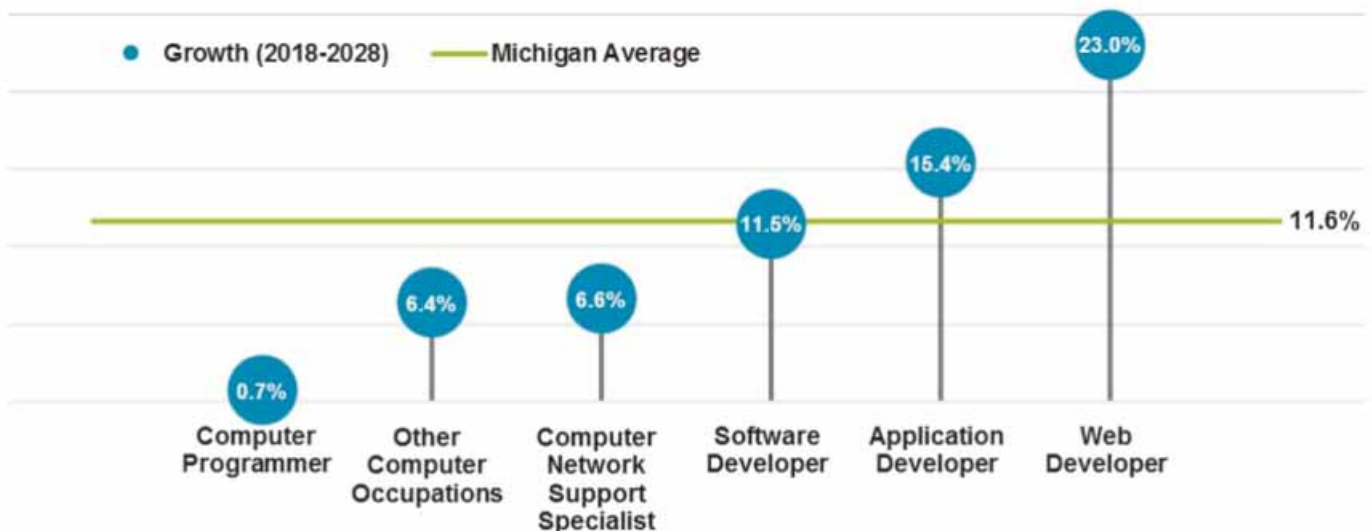
Spotlight on Computer Information Systems
