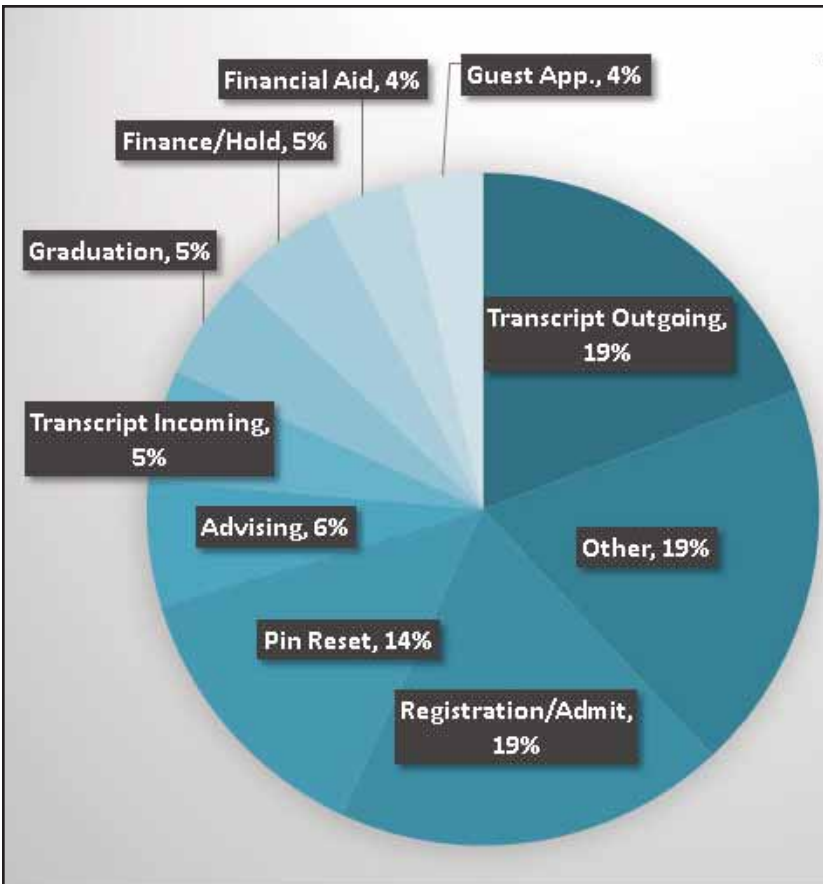
WCCCD participated in New Greater Bethlehem Temple's Community Expo and Health Fair.

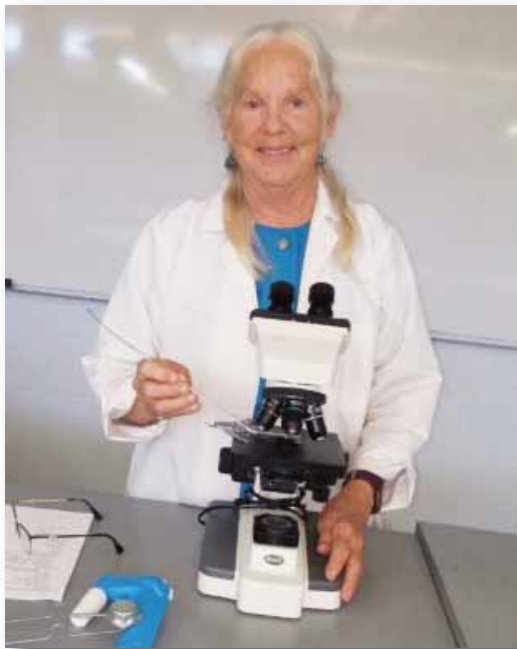

Participants were provided a definition of a rubric and discussed the various types. They also identified components of and steps to developing a rubric.



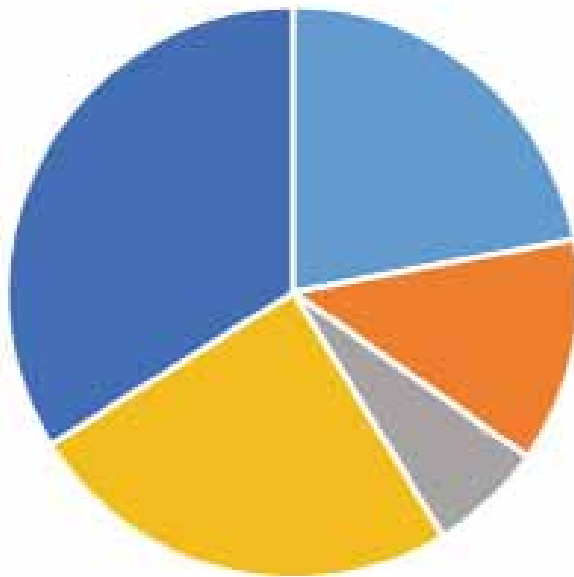

## What's Trending in IE: Part-time students

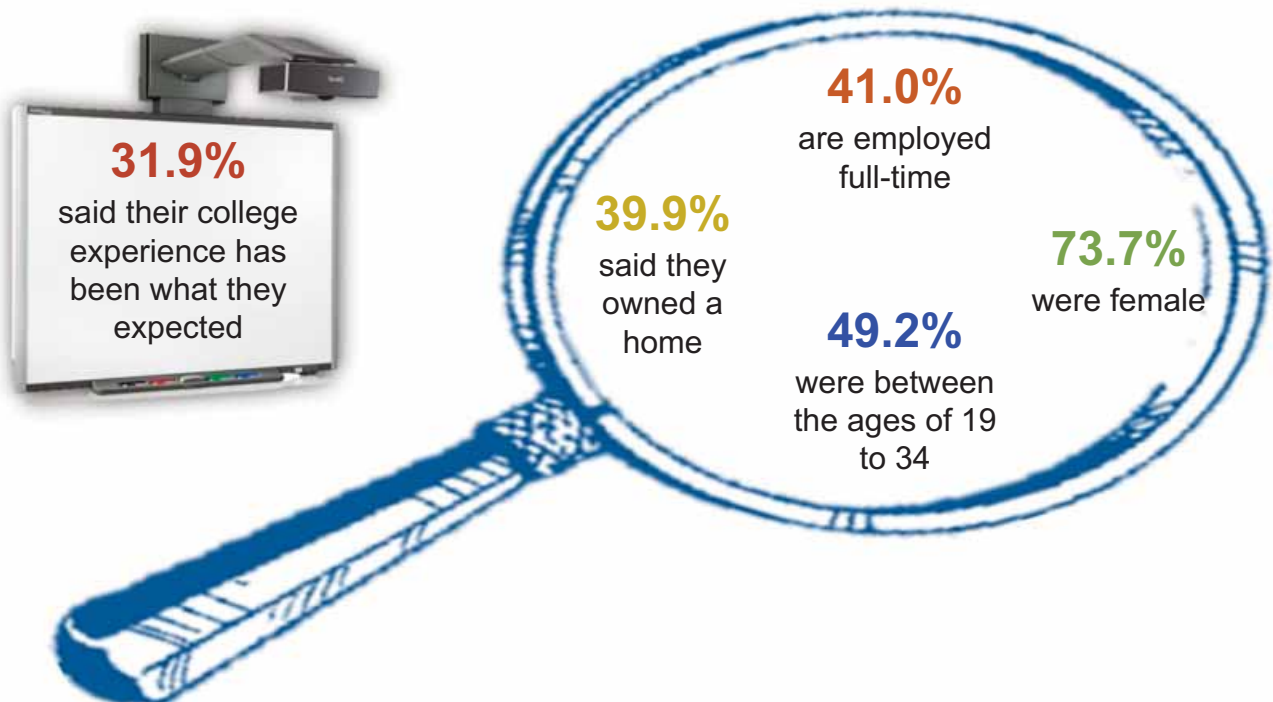
