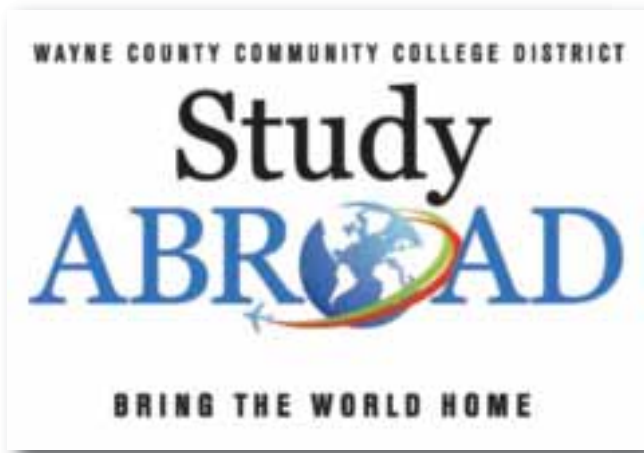

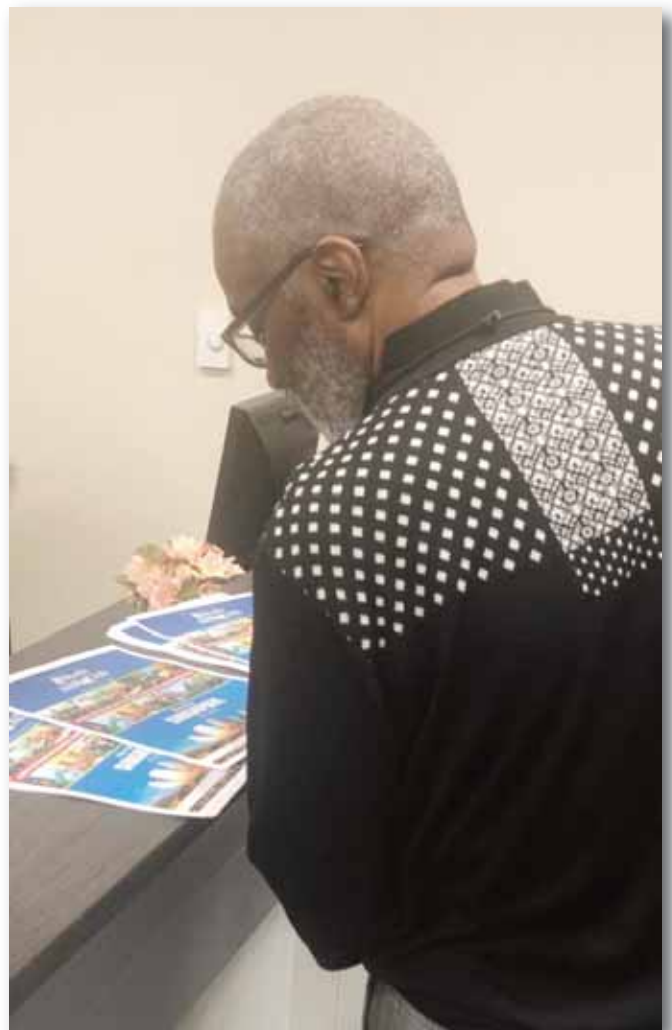

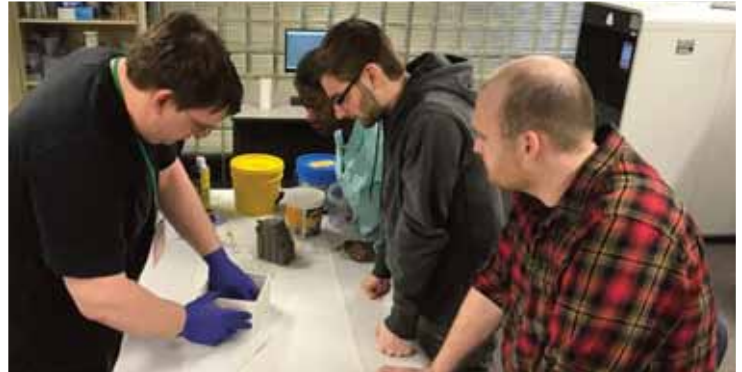

What's Trending in IE: Entering Student Experience

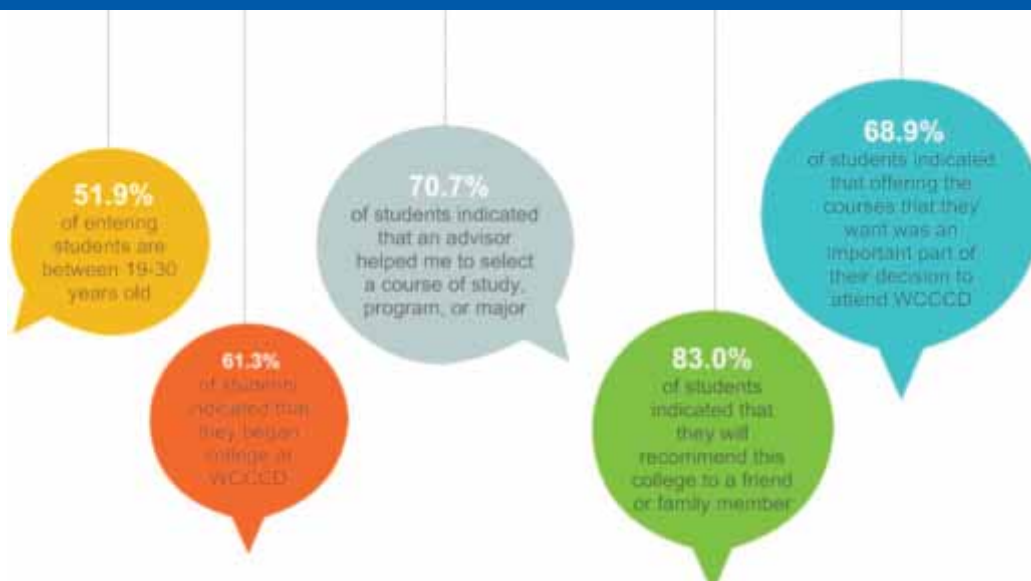

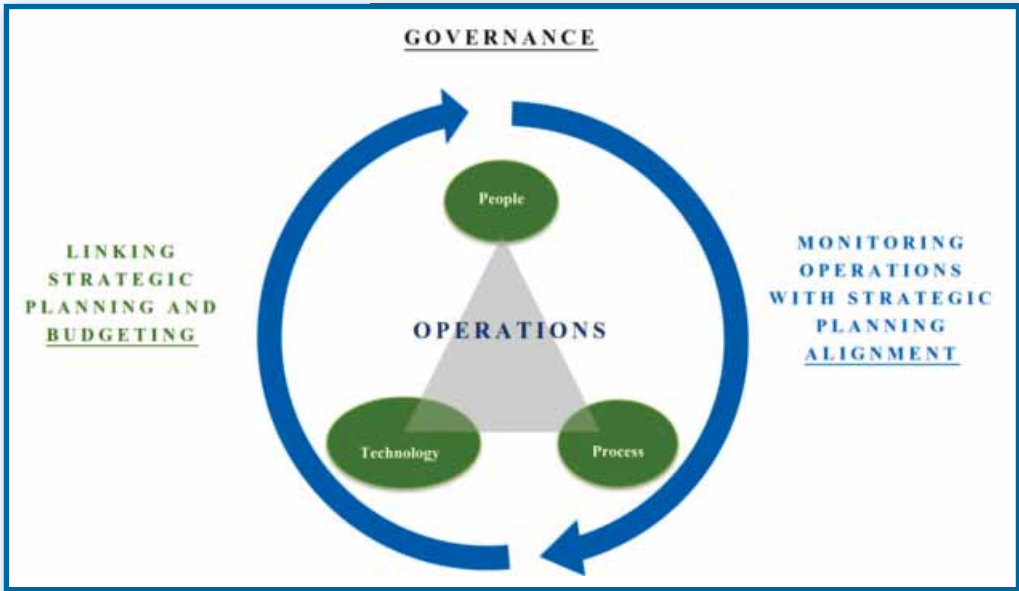

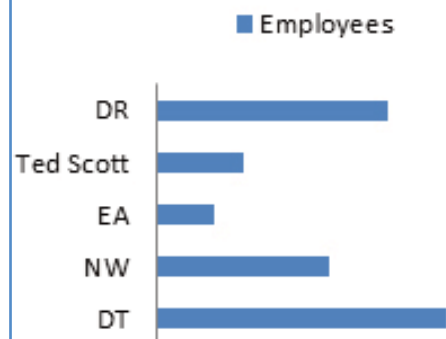
FMLA Compliance

The Division of Human Resources fully recognizes the importance of compliance with the Federal Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA). The District provides family/medical leave to eligible employees requiring unpaid time off for qualified medical and family reasons. The District works with a FMLA source, which is a third-party administrator, to ensure all leaves are FMLA compliant.

The following is the eligibility criteria for FMLA:

- The birth of a child or for child adoption or foster care
- To care for the employee's spouse, child, or parent who has a serious health condition
- For a serious health condition that makes the employee unable to perform the essential functions of his or her job
- For any qualifying emergency arising out of the fact that a spouse, son, daughter, or parent is a military member on covered active duty or call to covered active duty status.

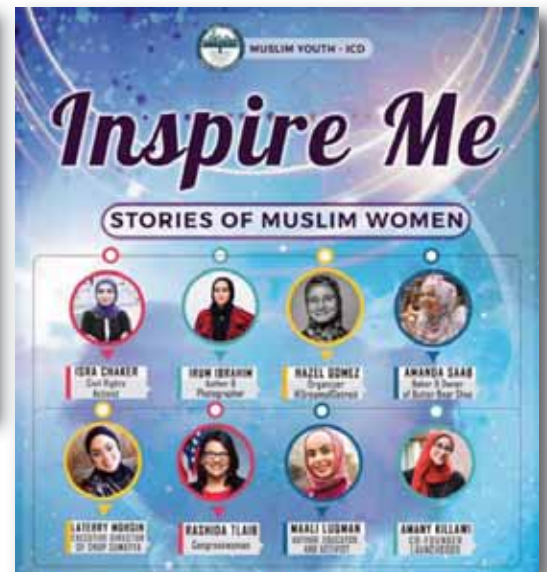

Rennard Martin represented the District at the Job Fair for Probationers and Parolees Michigan Department of Corrections (MDOC). More than 500 participants were in attendance.

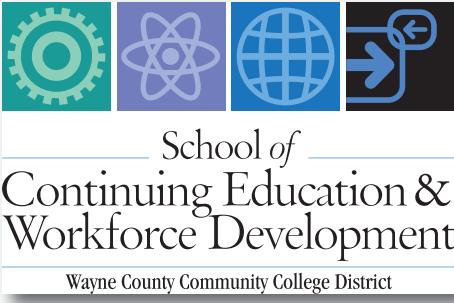

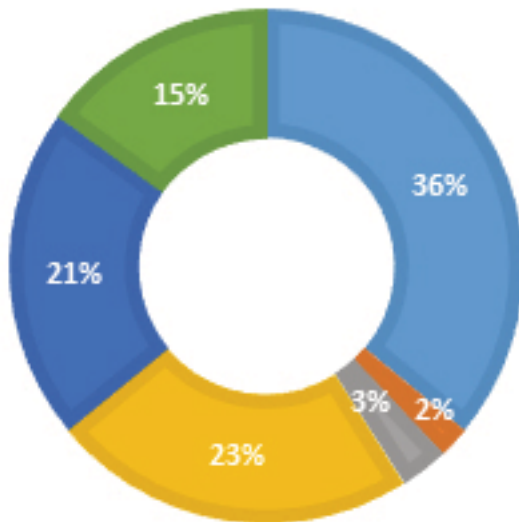




The enrollment chart represents the activity from Monday to Saturday for the week of **March 25 – 30, 2019** at each campus.

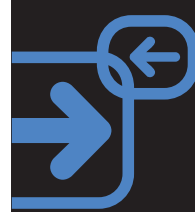

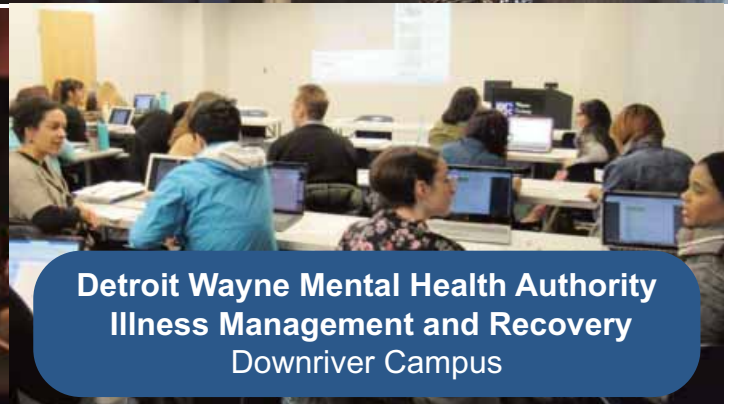

The Van Buren Area Little League hosted their coaches workshop which gave them the opportunity to meet their teams.

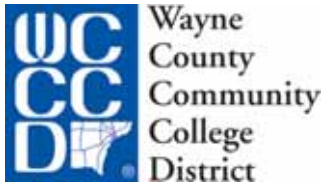
