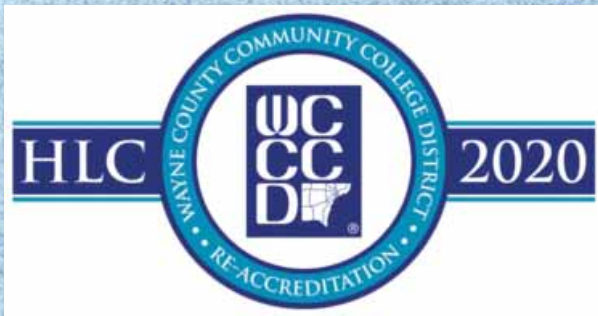

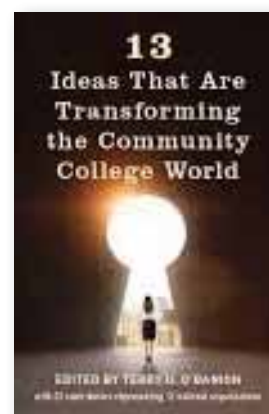
In the Mail...

Fall 2019 Academic Schedule



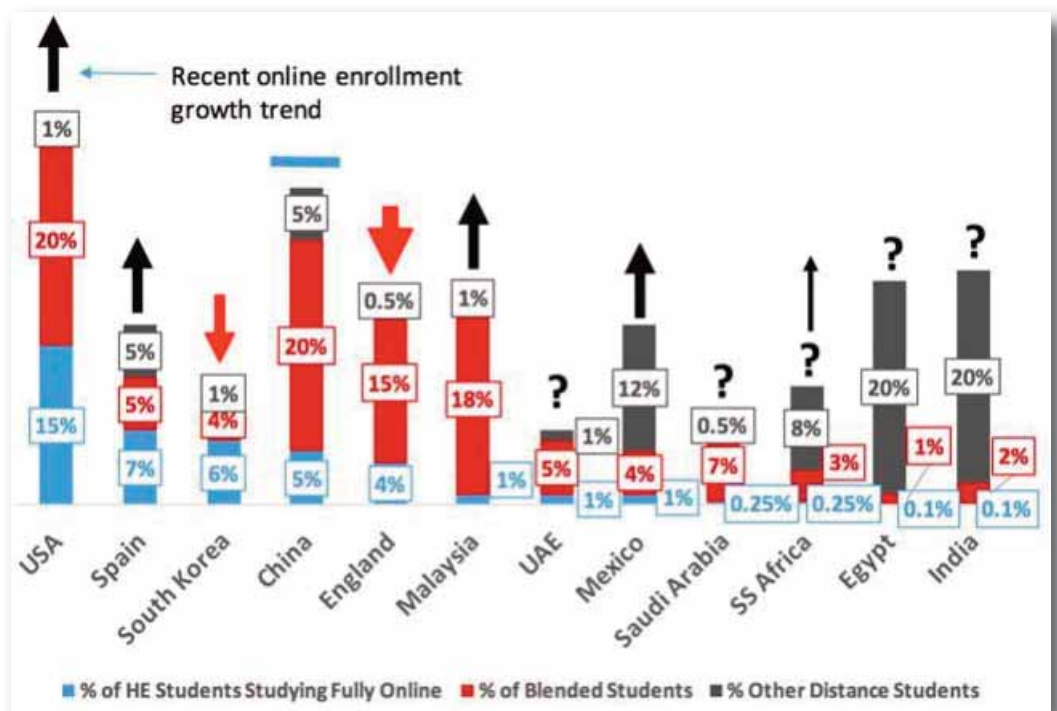

Distance Learning



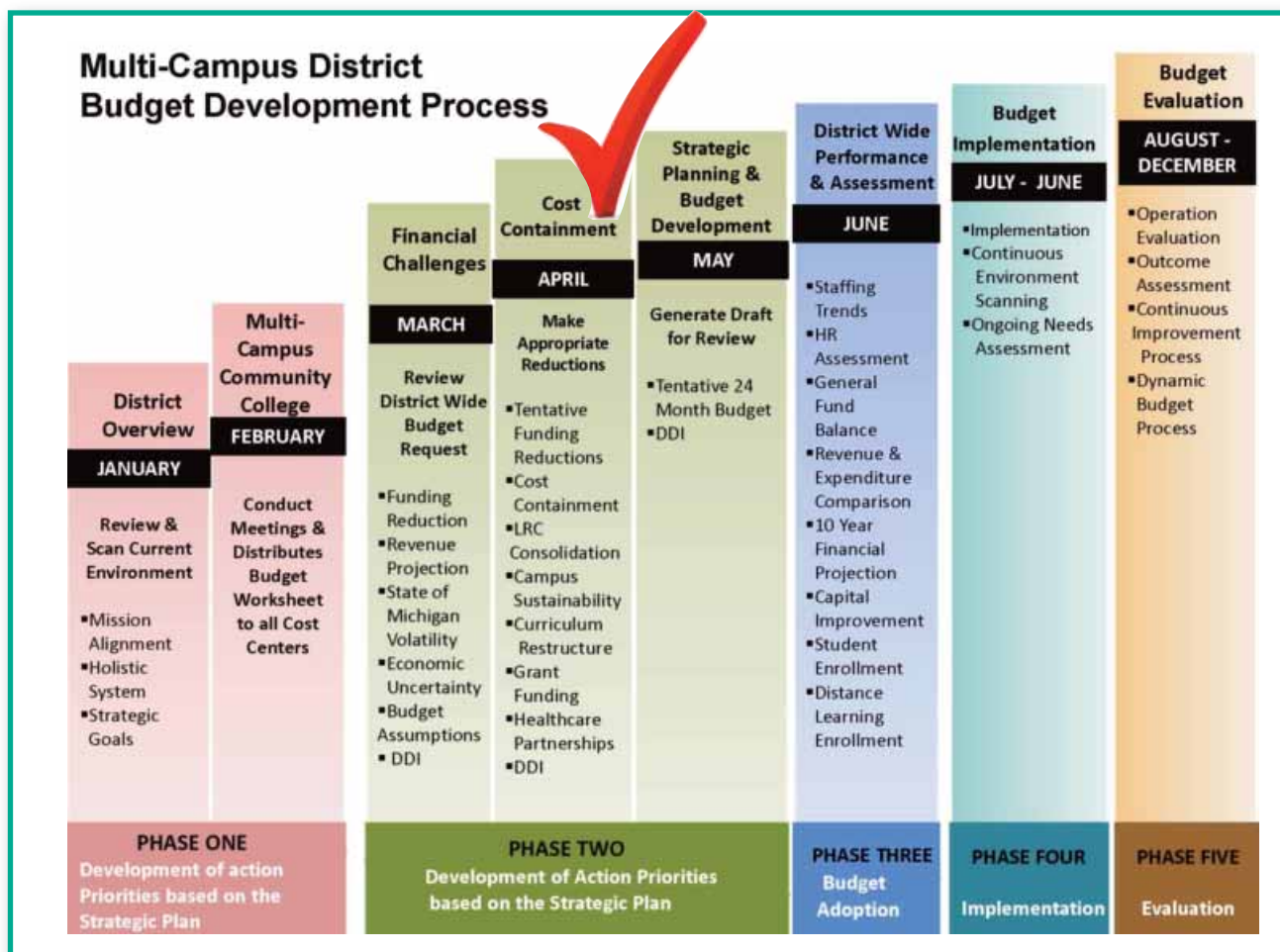
Estimated share of fully online, blended, and other distance students in domestic higher education, with recent-year growth trends illustrated, for case study markets, 2016.

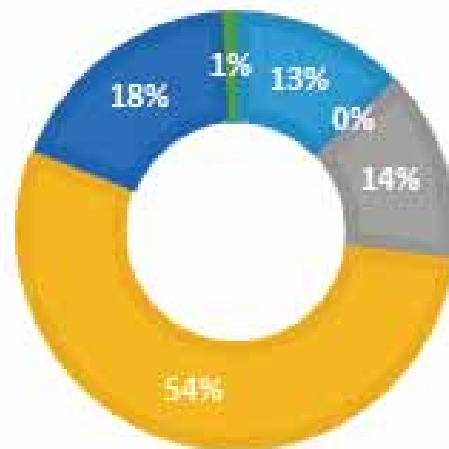
