

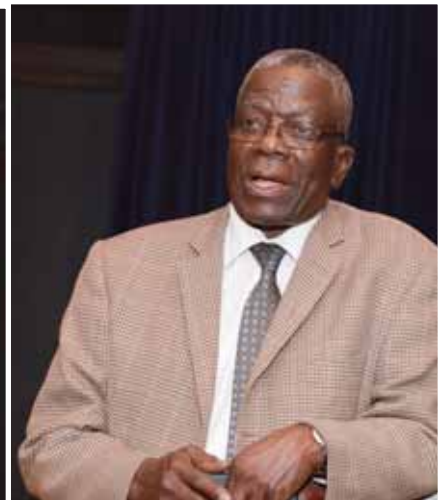

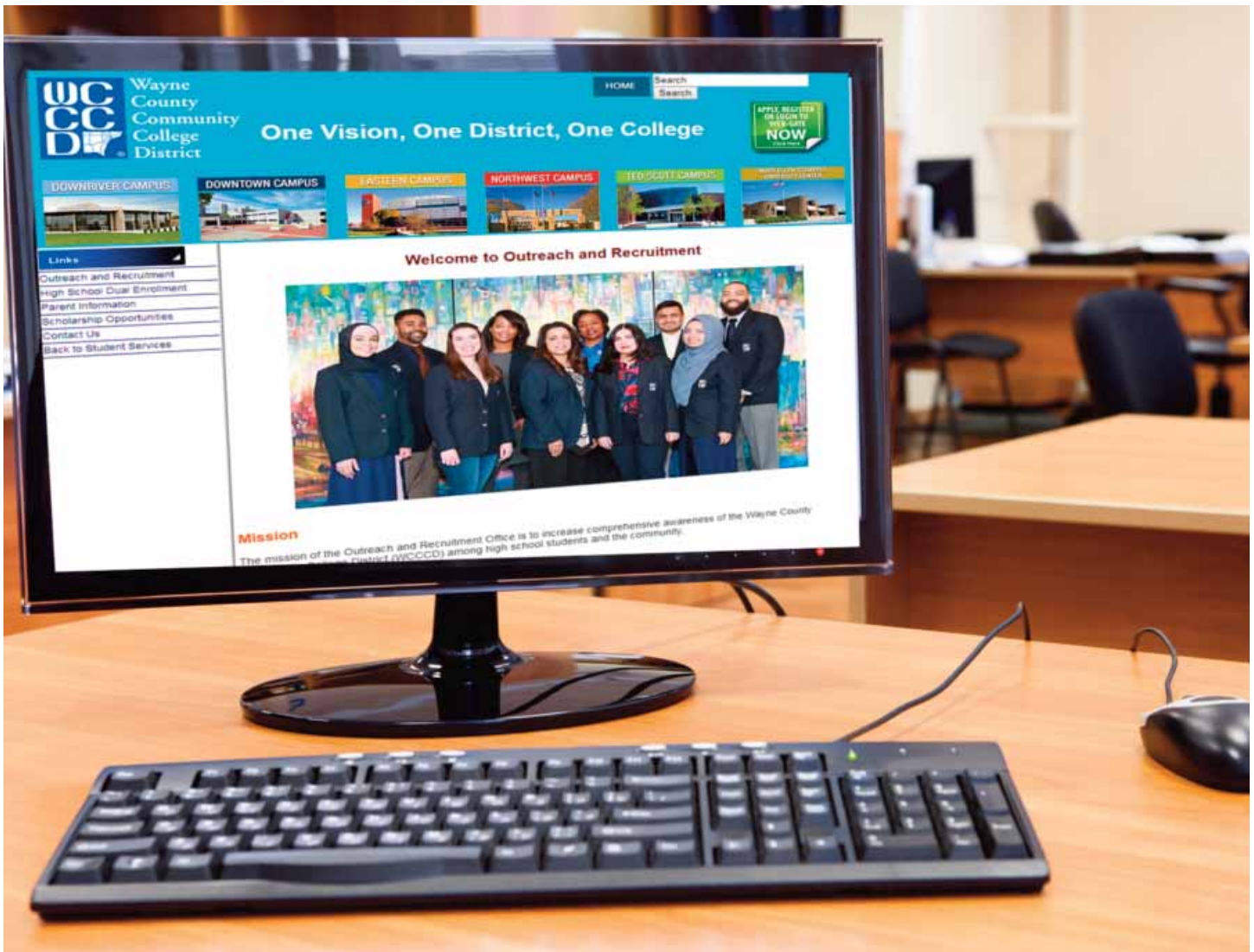


Division of Student Services
