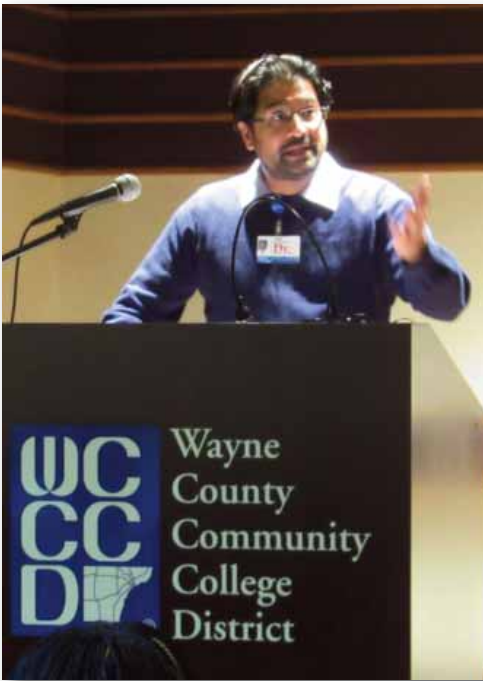

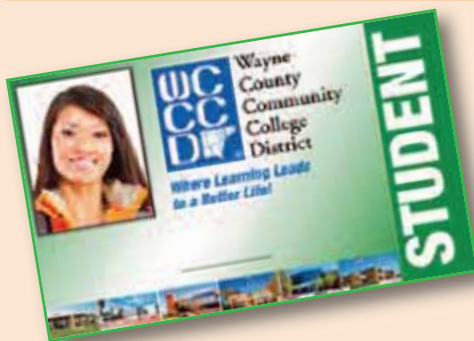
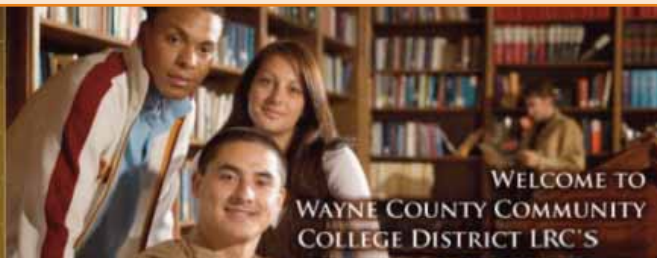

New Leadership in Lansing

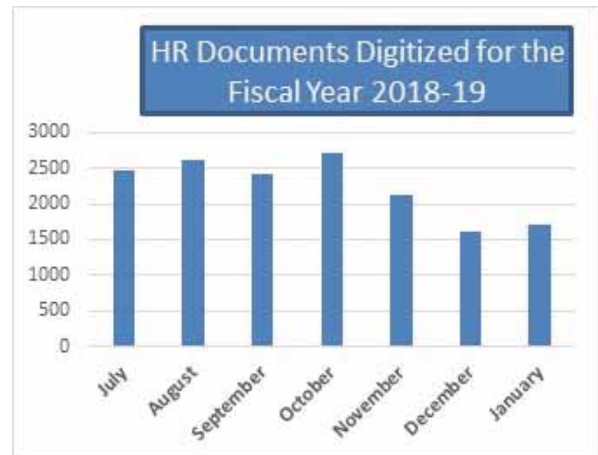
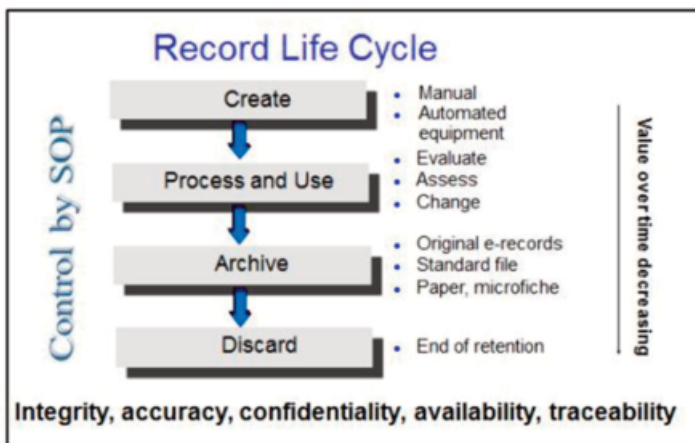

- Criterion Five:** Resources, Planning, and Institutional Effectiveness

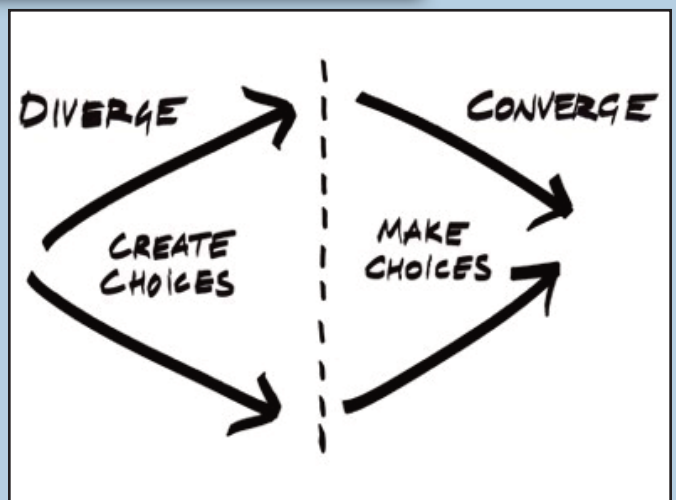

Using a human-centered approach, such as design thinking, requires divergent thinking in addition to convergent thinking. Divergent thinking captures many possible choices based on insights gathered from the end-user for the problem-solver to consider; whereas, convergent thinking is focused on a single, correct choice. Because problem solvers most often begin with the logical convergent thinking approach, starting with the creative divergent thinking approach to gather a multitude of choices may yield an unexpected, innovative solution.

Syllabus Review for Online Courses

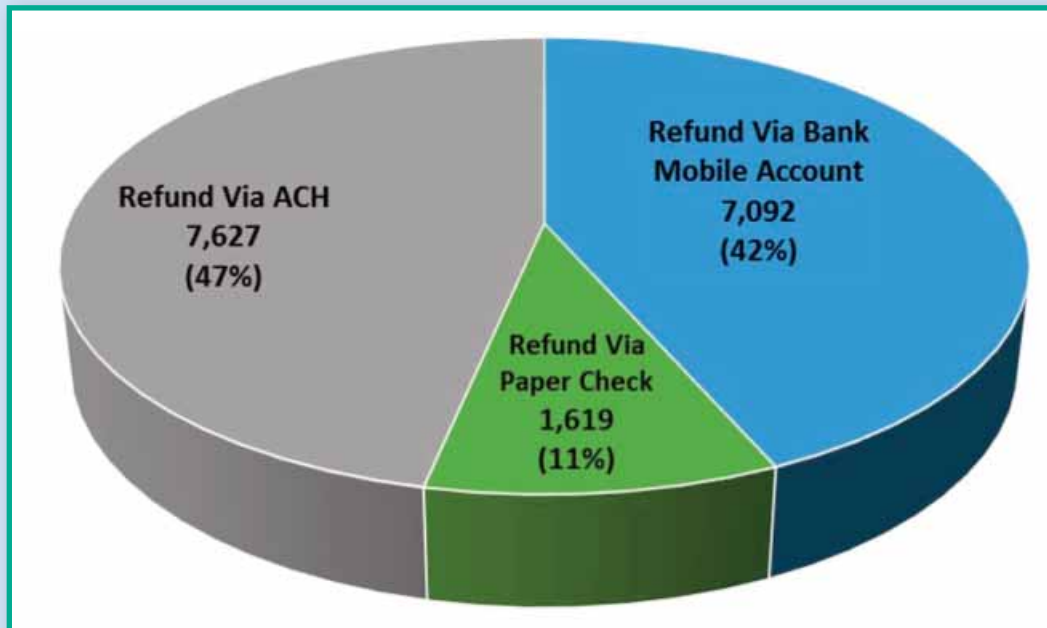
With the semester underway, the Distance Learning team will begin to conduct syllabi review for online courses. Online students require very simple, highly detailed, easy to understand and clearly written information about their online course. An online syllabus contains much of the same information as a syllabus for a traditional face-to-face course, but often with greater detail.

A recent study reveals, more than 6.3 million students in the U.S. – most of whom were undergraduates – took at least one online course in Fall 2016, a 5.6 percent increase from the previous year. Online courses are a popular option for students at WCCCD who are required to “take at least 51% of their degree or certificate requirements in an on campus, face-to-face environment.”



Division of Administration and Finance

Student Refunds



WCCCD has been in partnership with Bank Mobile since January, 2015 (formerly known as Higher One) to provide secure, fast and efficient delivery of financial aid funds to our students. Students are offered three choices for how to receive their refunds. Nearly 15,000 students have chosen to open a Bank Mobile debit card account, designed specifically for students.

In 2018, 17,605 refunds were processed:

- 42% were received through a Bank Mobile debit card account (same day)
- 47% were received through ACH direct deposit (1-2 business days)
- 11% were received through paper check mailed to their home (7-10 days)

89% of our students refunds are via electronic delivery.

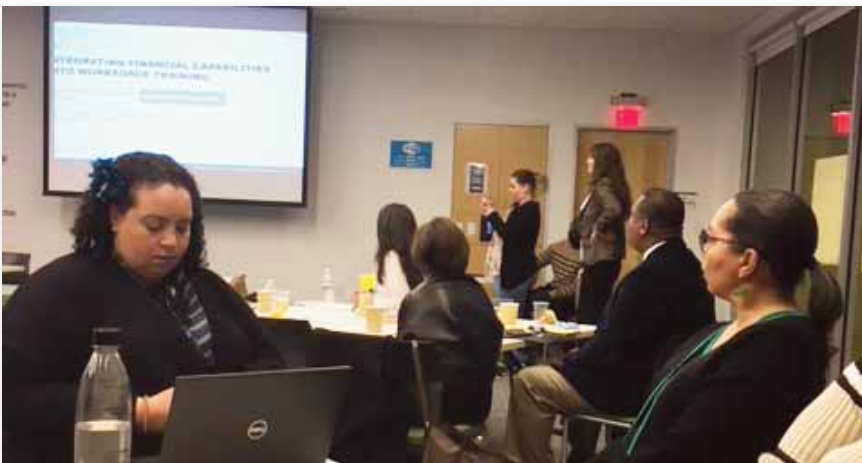
