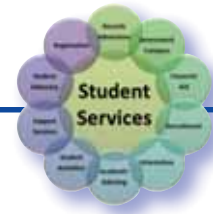

## Scholarship Committee



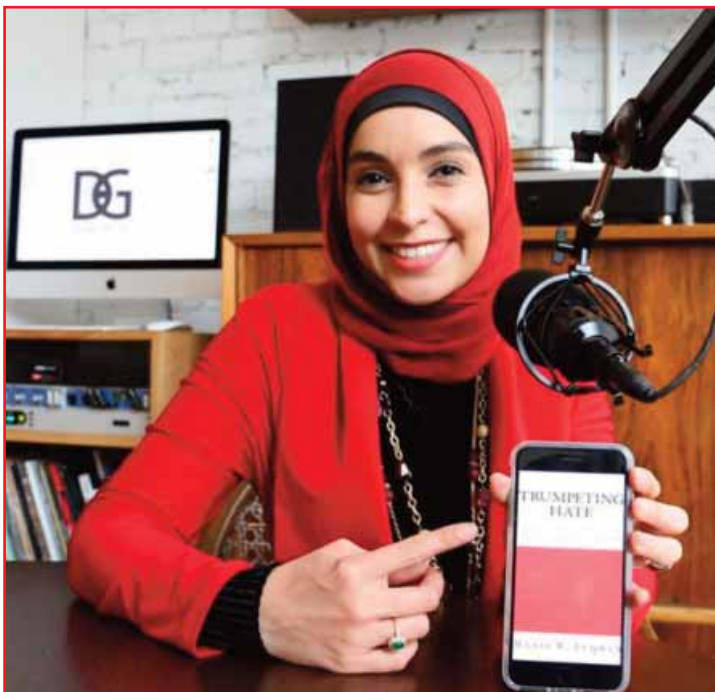
The scholarship committee met to review 2019-20 scholarship applications.

## Students Historic Bus Tour

The TRIO students and some of the summer interns visited the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center in Cincinnati, Ohio. They also toured the homes of famous abolitionists John Rankin and John Parker in Ripley, Ohio, while learning the story and history of Eliza from *Uncle Tom's Cabin* when she who crossed the river from Kentucky to Ripley, Ohio to freedom.



Students experienced the Slave Pen built in the early 1800's, which was recovered in 2003 from a farm in Maysville, Kentucky. The two-story cabin sits on the 2nd floor of the museum. It was used as a holding pen by Kentucky slave trader, Capt. John W. Anderson, to keep enslaved people who would later be sold down the river to Natchez, MS.

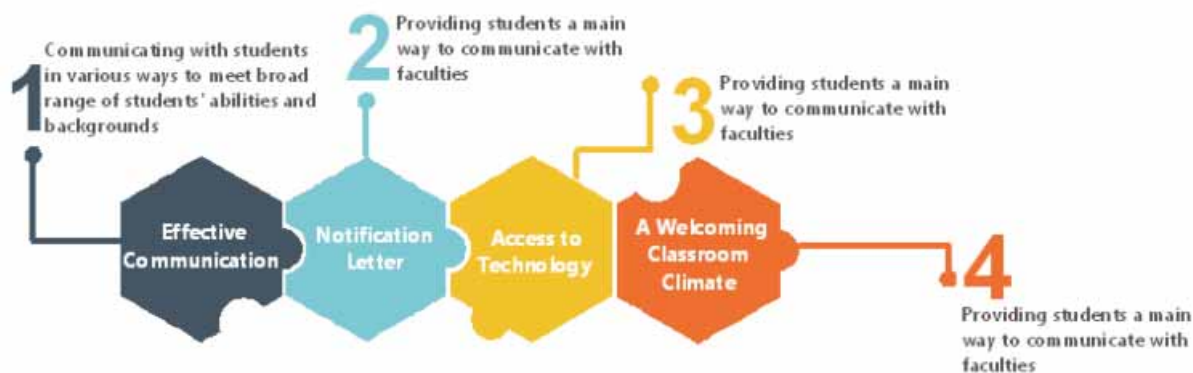

The Office of Institutional Effectiveness reviews national research to assist divisions with improving the programs and service offered to students. The University of Oregon studied the best practices for faculties in their classrooms. Below you will find some of the results from the study.

### Best Practices for Faculty

### Below you will find some data points from WCCCD Faculty Instructional Experience in Spring 2018:

Faculties are often incorporating each items within their courses:

- 60.2%** In-class assessment to determine student preparedness
- 52.2%** Early warning notices and communications of poor performance to students
- 47.7%** Group presentation
- 47.3%** Academic advising planning
- 44.8%** Study time and assignment support

**79.1%** 79.1% of faculties were often/sometimes incorporating the library resources/ activities within there courses.

**66.2%** 66.2% of faculties were often/sometime incorporating the computer lab within their courses.

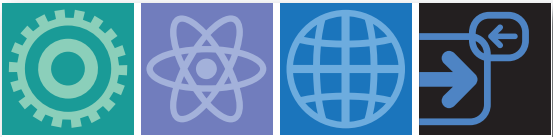

The Ted Scott hosted the PAWS with a CAUSE – Puppy Obedience Training Workshop.

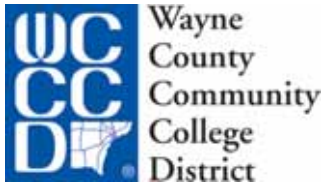
