Northwestern High School assembled their seniors together for a WCCCD presentation and onsite admissions event.

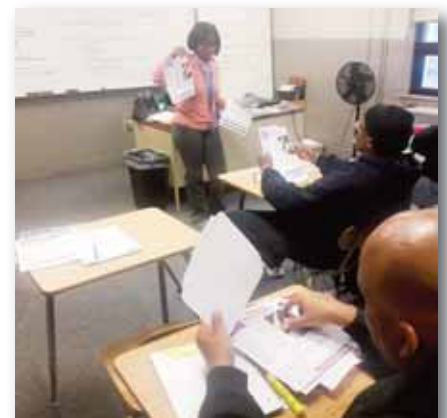


Wildcat Wednesday was held at Cass Technical High School. This initiative allows students to ask questions ranging from graduation requirements, transcripts and transfer programs.

Donations still being accepted for the Student Executive Council Food Pantry



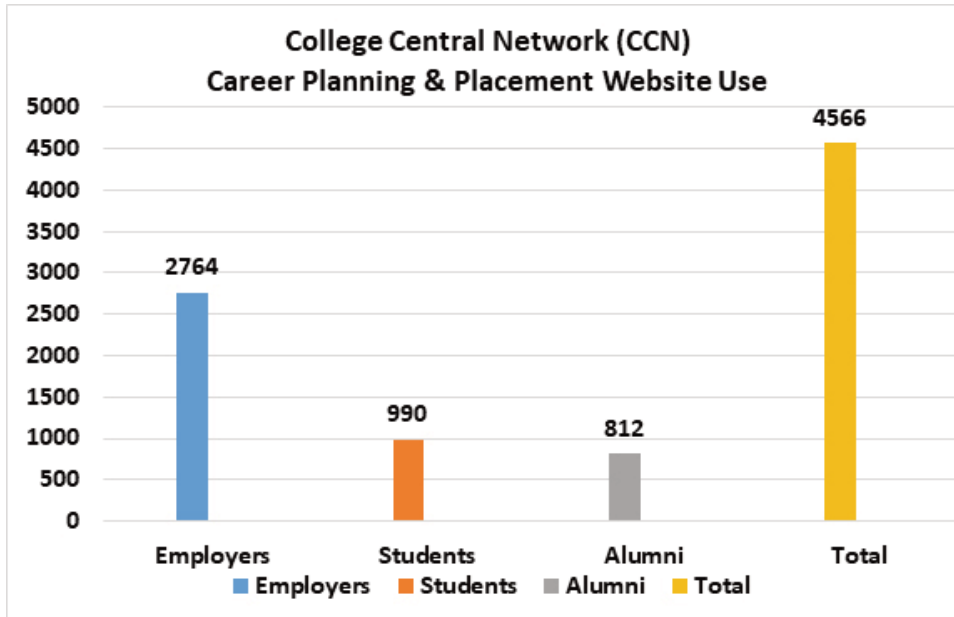

Survivor's Speak Wrongful Conviction Workshop

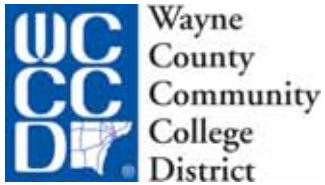
