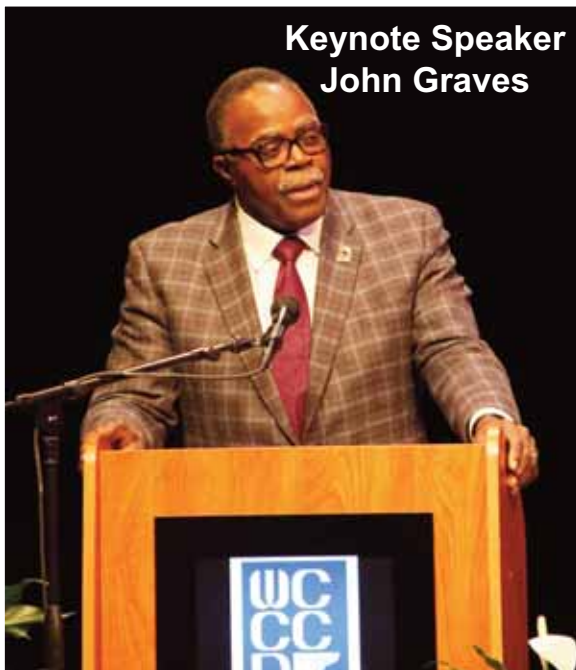

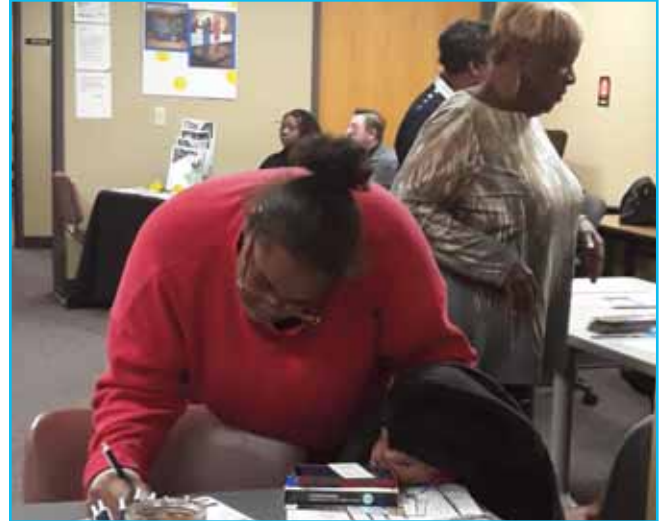
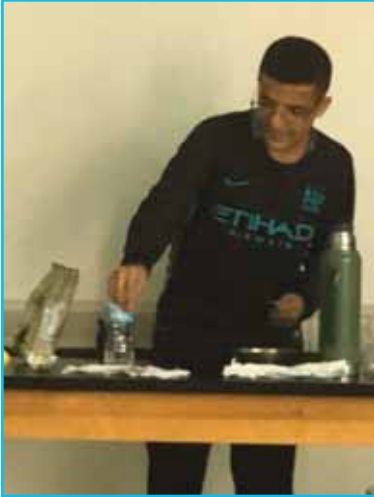

Professor Iris Green's Anthropology 152 class took a field trip to Wayne State University to visit their school of Anthropology.

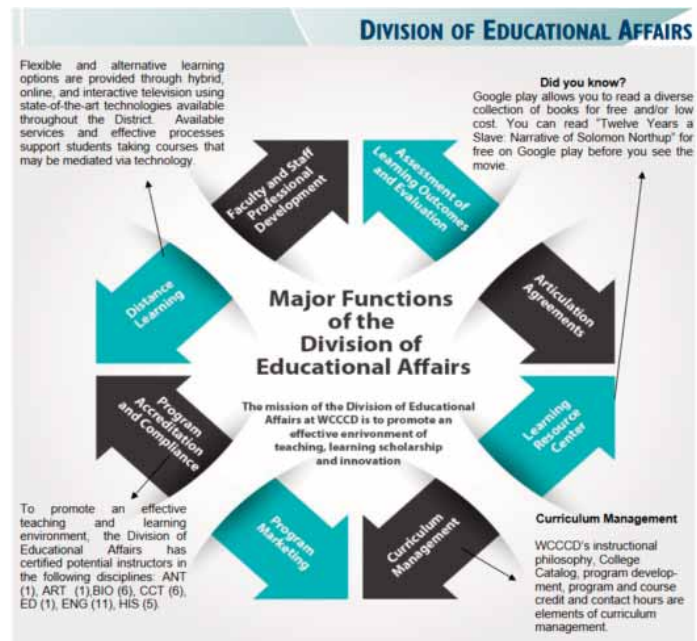

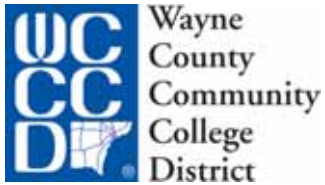


## Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority (AKA) Membership Workshop
