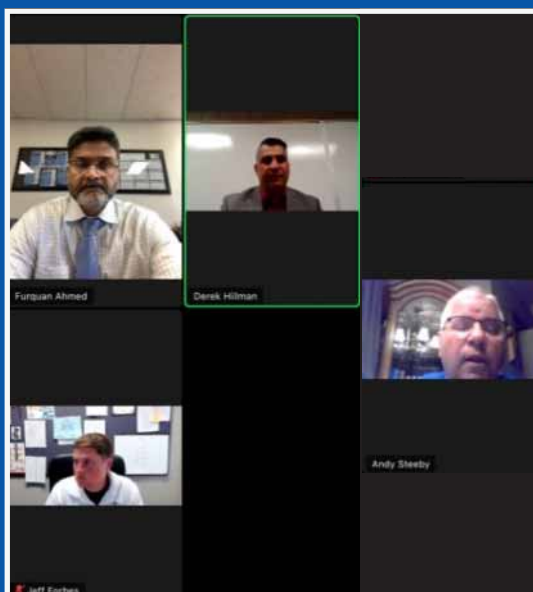


Leadership Team Meeting

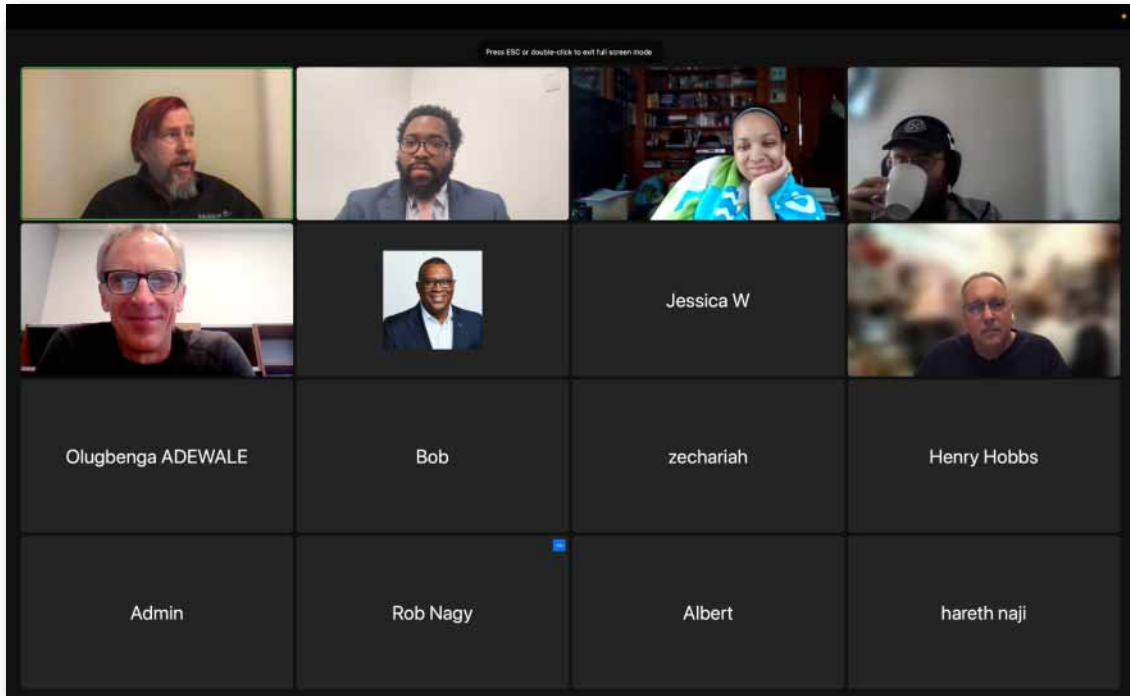

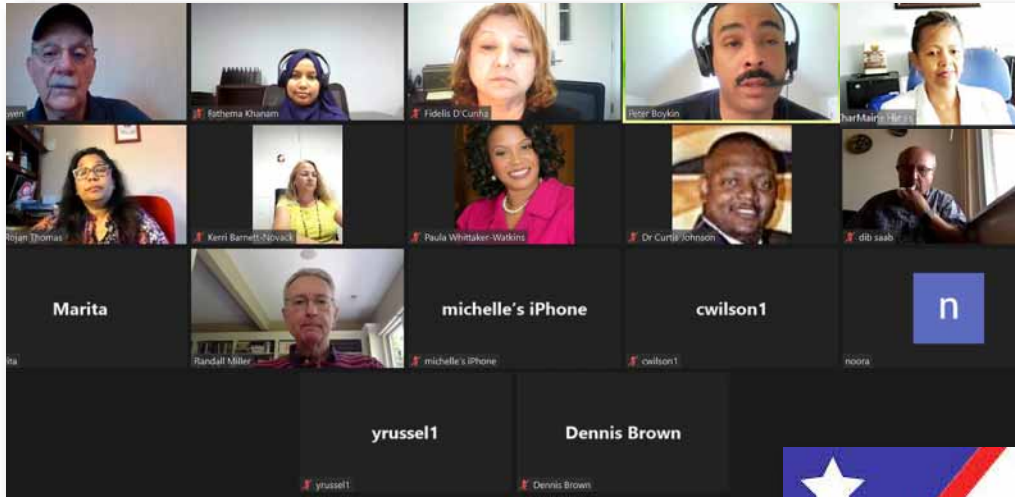

Do Hard Things

Knowing life will send lots of adversity our way, to handle it successfully it is important to develop toughness, notes Steve Magness in his book, *Do Hard Things*.

We all face an inner battle when faced with tough times. The key is understanding this process and learning how to navigate through it. True toughness “is about navigating-paying attention to the voices in your head and making adjustments to address or overcome them.” We need to learn to understand our reality so we can marshal the appropriate response.

Sometimes we need to learn to be comfortable with uncomfortable situations and develop the ability to be comfortable in our own head. “Real confidence lies in understanding who you are and what you are capable of doing-it is founded in doing the work. It means doing difficult things, sometimes failing, but seeing where you lie, and then getting back to work.”

Speaking about stock traders, Magness notes that it “wasn’t traders with better credentials who excelled at making risky decisions, it was the ones who could read their own minds and bodies.”

Whether we call it equanimity, patience, or responding instead of reacting, we all must learn how to find a way forward in difficult times. Radiating warmth and openness along with mental toughness help us to overcome the stresses of life.

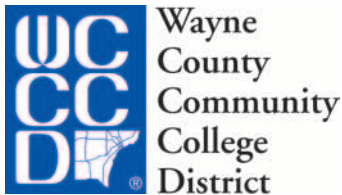
Wayne Metro Detroit Tax Relief Fund
