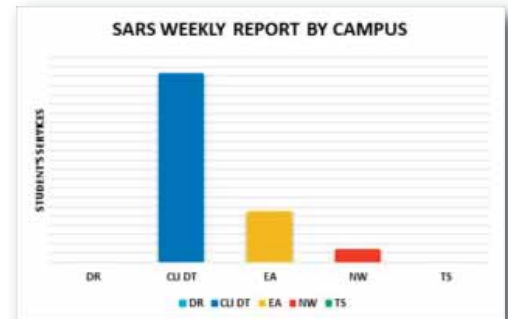

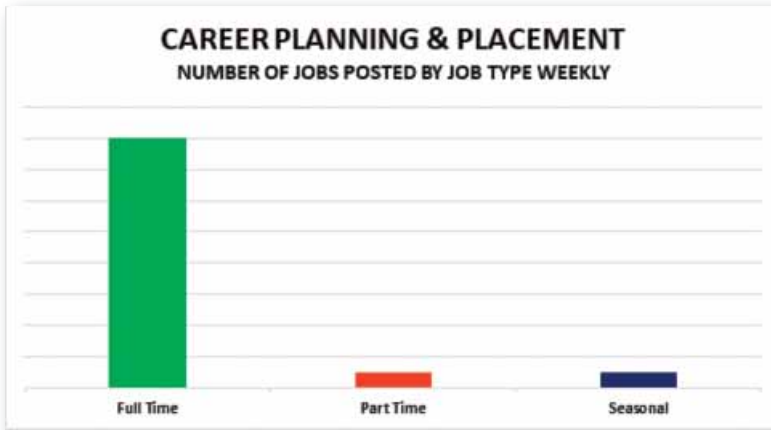

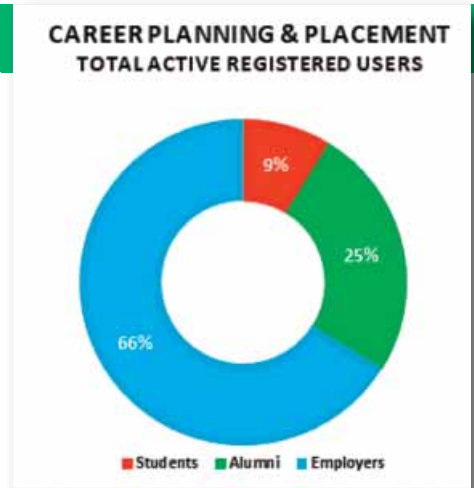

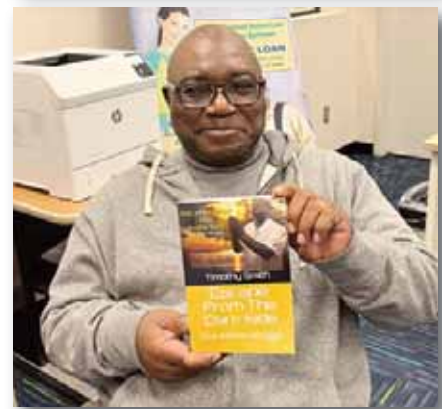
This chart displays the number of jobs posted at WCCCD based on the job types that have posted.

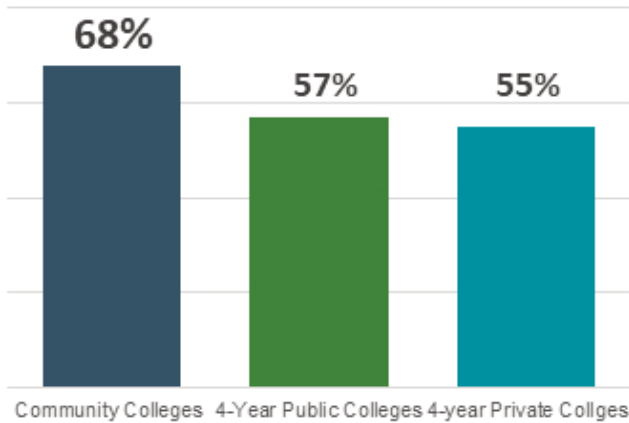

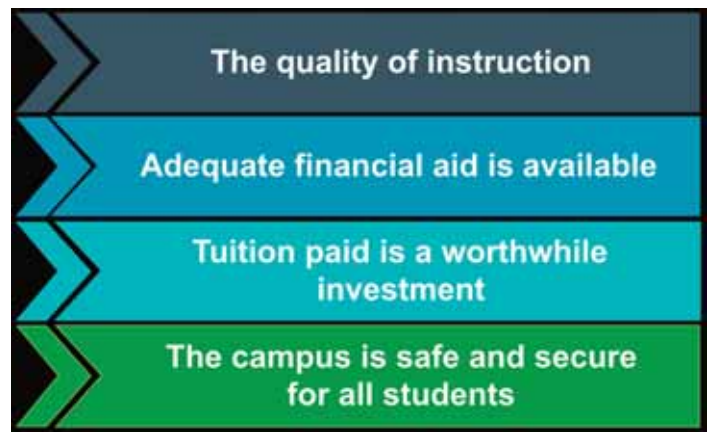
What's Trending: Student Satisfaction

Student Satisfaction by Institution Type



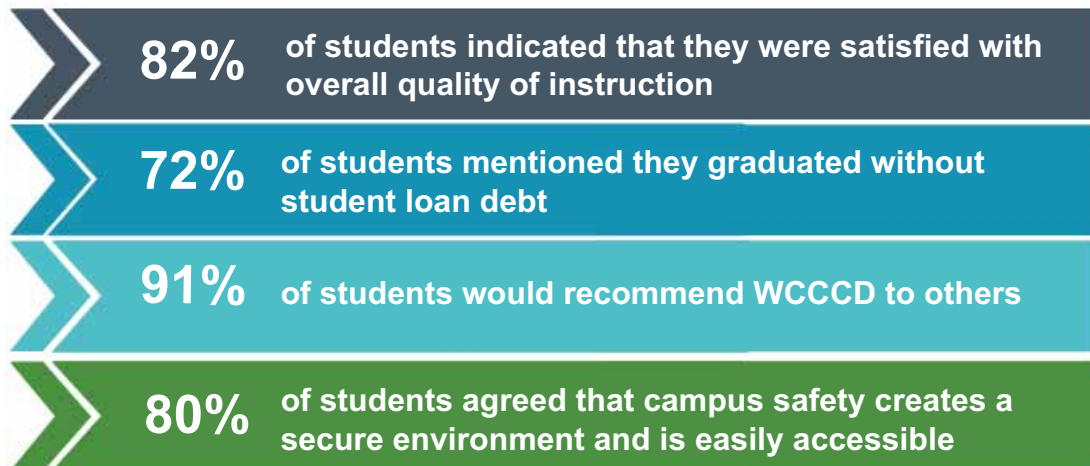
RNL found the following items to be most important for institutions to monitor in order to best serve students:

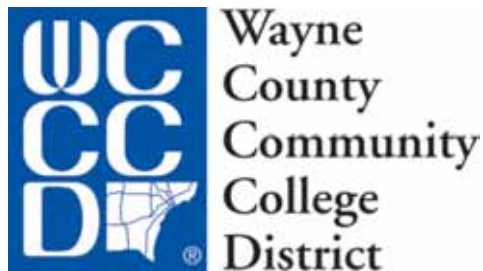
