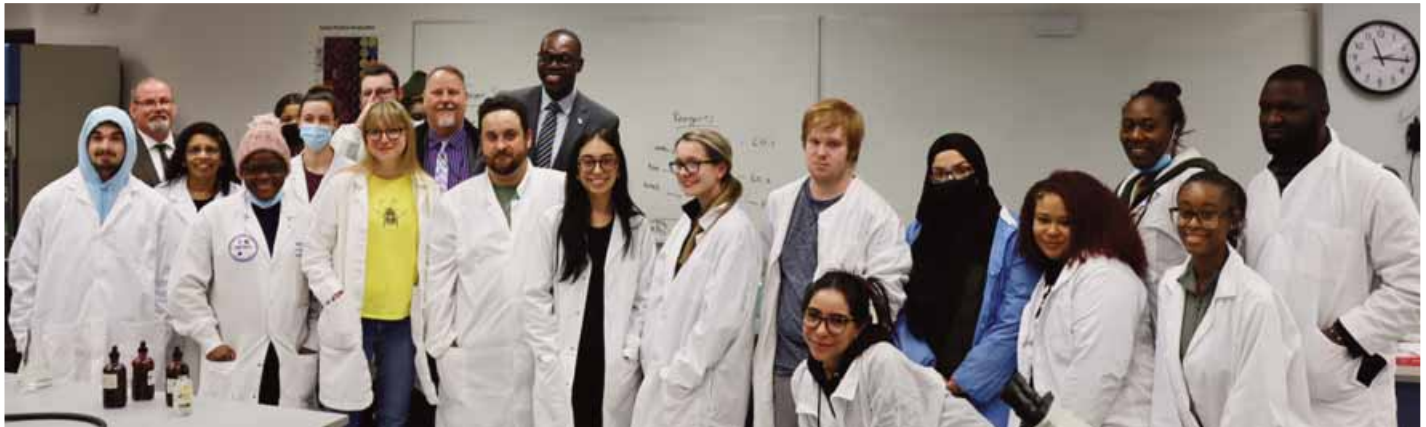

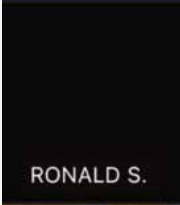
Entrepreneurship Resource Center

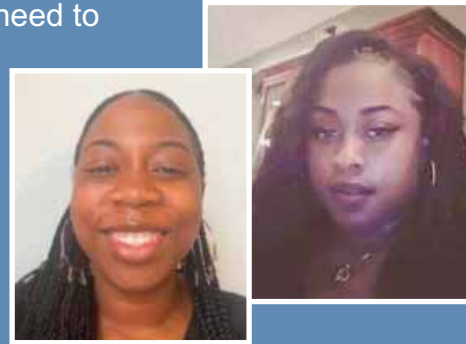
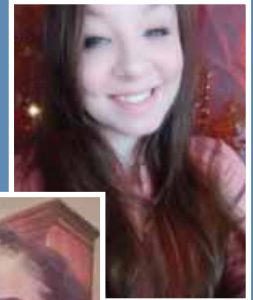

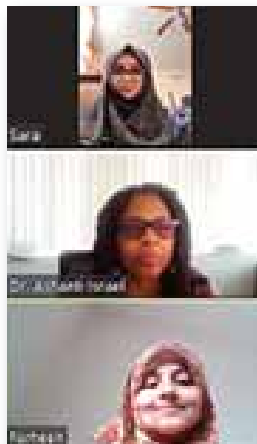

Staff continue to process Spring 2023 dual enrollment applications for high school students.

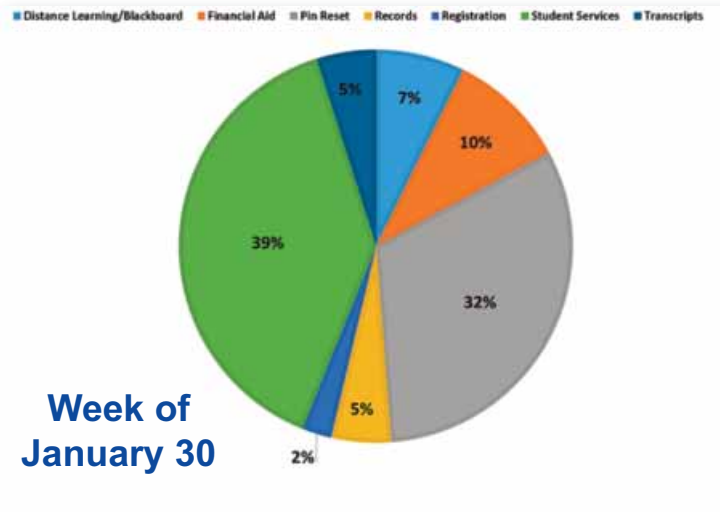


Federal Work-Study Program

WCCCD Offers e-Transcript Service!



National Student Clearinghouse e-Transcript

Wayne County Community College District has partnered with National Student Clearinghouse to offer and accept online e-transcript orders. Students and alumni are able to order official e-transcripts 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The added service and cost provide the following benefits:

- Access to Next Generation Transcript Experience ordering, up to 50% faster, and receive electronic transcript in 15 minutes or less
- Online uploading and managing of additional documents to send with transcript
- 24/7 online ordering and order tracking
- Automated confirmations, updates, and problem notifications
- Instant text alerts
- Seamless accessibility on any device



The Division of Student Services is pleased to announce that online transcripts are now available for ordering through the National Student Clearinghouse.

This service is designed to provide a convenient and secure way for our students and alumni to order official transcripts from WCCCD.
