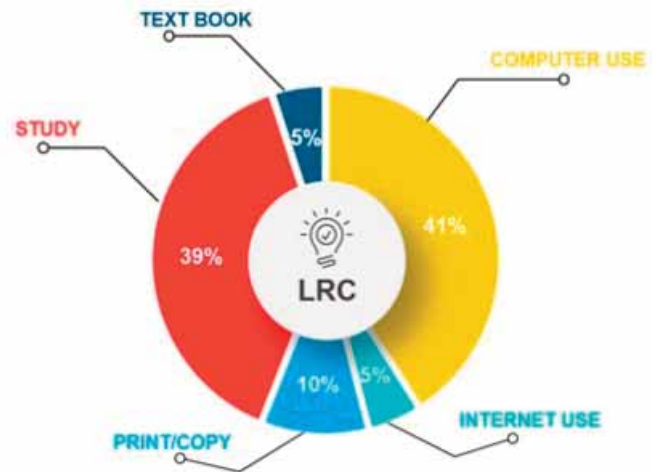


WCCCD 'Everywhere in the Workplace'

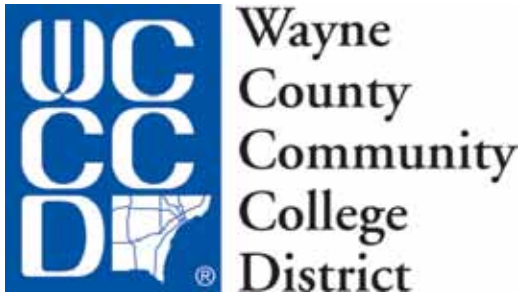


Health Science Center
