



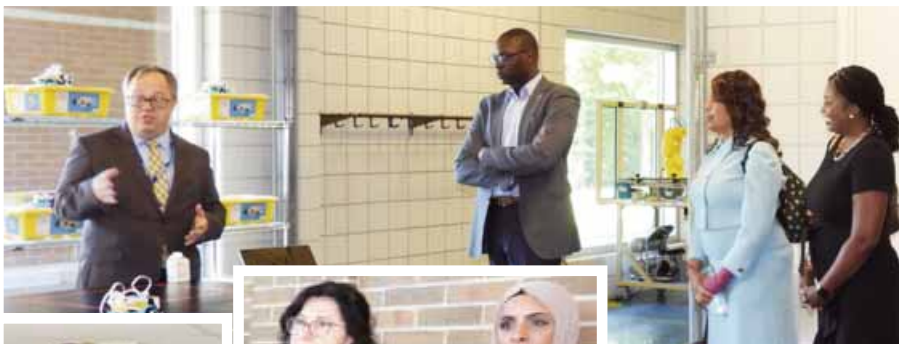
## WCCCD Welcomes Lieutenant Governor Garlin Gilchrist

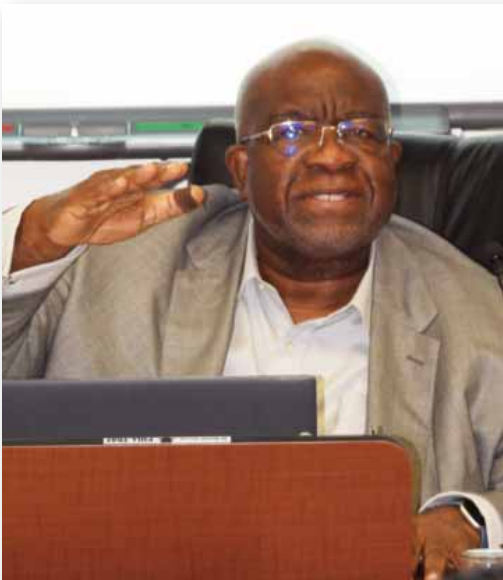

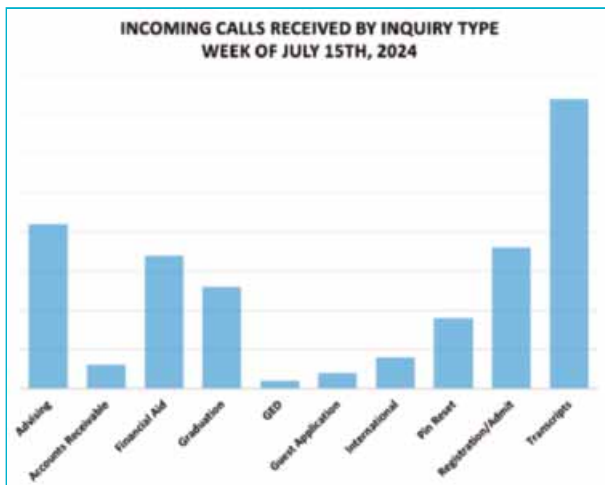
## Student Services Weekly Informational Session

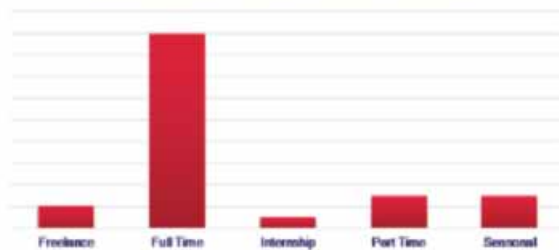
## Career Planning and Placement

- Utilizing flexible registration systems

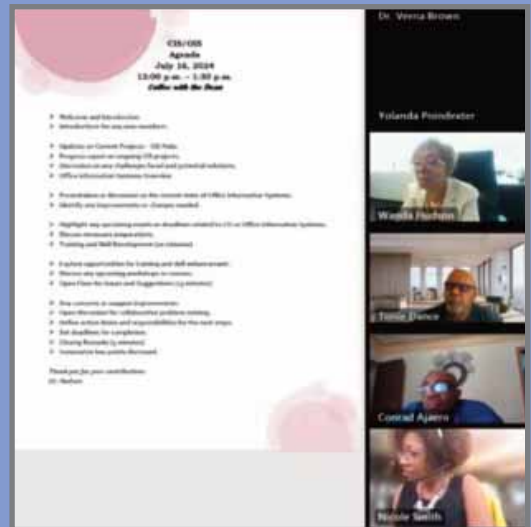


The recommendations will be considered as possible enhancements to career and technical education delivery and options available to non-traditional students at WCCCD.

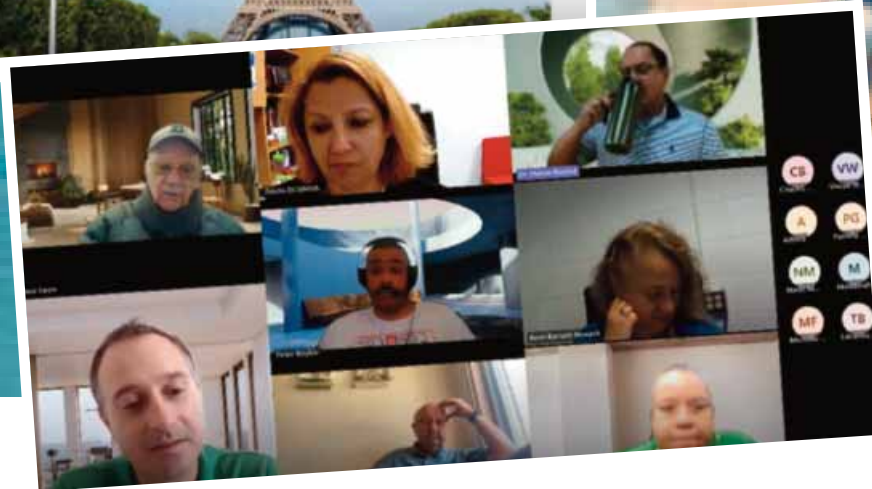

### *Trusting Others*

Tim Levine, a communication professor and known as the creator of the truth-default theory, argues that “human beings never developed sophisticated and accurate skills to detect deception, and human beings tend to assume that strangers are truthful,” notes Malcolm Gladwell in *Talking to Strangers*. Levine makes the case that in exchange for assuming strangers are truthful, we generally get a good trade-off of “being vulnerable only to the occasional lie in exchange for good communication.”

Staff visited the Detroit Riverfront to host an exciting outdoor yoga class and provide community members with information about the facility's membership class offerings.

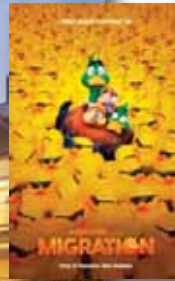
